Our TFB Worship Choir, led by Randy Stager, will take us on a poignant musical journey that explores the majesty and mystery of the Cross.



Tenebrae Service Friday, April 14 7:30 p.m.

Tenebrae is Latin for "shadows" or "darkness." The darkness reminds us of the time between the Last Supper and Jesus' body being put into the tomb.

The purpose of the service is to recreate the betrayal, abandonment, and agony of the Cross, and it is left unfinished, because the story isn't over until Easter Day.



Robert B. Reich, former Secretary of Labor, talked about the use of his *Pronoun Test* when he visited the workplaces of America.

"I administrate a simple test I call the "Pronoun Test." I ask frontline workers a few general questions about the company. If the answers I get back describe the company in terms like "they" and "them," then I know it's one kind of company. If the answers are put in terms like "we" or "us," I know it's a different kind of company."

If you were asked some general questions about TFB, which pronouns would you use? The more of us that would use the "we" or "us" pronouns, the healthier and stronger we will be. This is pointed out very clearly in 1 Corinthians 12 using the illustration of the body to teach this principle. Every part of the body has an important function in order for the whole body to work effectively. Using "we" and "us" pronouns communicates this principle in a powerful way.

God is very clear about our need for others to minister His grace and love to us so that each of us can be healthy growing Christians. In Genesis 2, God said it was not good for Adam to be alone, even though Adam had a perfect relationship with God at that point. In Ephesians we are told that God's family, the church, is designed in such a way that helping each other is essential to health and vitality.

"Under His direction, the whole body is fitted together perfectly. As each part does its own special work, it helps the other parts grow so that the whole body is healthy and growing and full of love" (Ephesians 4:16, NLT).

My prayer is that we are each guided by the Holy Spirit in doing our own special work that helps others grow, and that TFB experiences spiritual health and vitality by being a place where people continually meet God and are transformed by His Spirit. Pastor Charlie

Prayer to the Lord was my only recourse. Early the next morning, my taxi took me to Kenyatta International Airport. Finding a quiet room, I prepared to have my morning devotions. It was a very large room, and <u>no one</u> <u>else was there</u>. A few minutes later, a man entered this large room and sat across the aisle from me. Surprise!! I knew him. We





Here's more on the High School's journey through *Rooted*: We are now on Week 7 (of 10), and a couple of weeks ago we embarked on our Prayer Experience as part of learning how God speaks with us. 



Sad News: I regret to inform you of the death of one of our California members and very dear friend. I first met Andrea at a Surfer's Bible Study. She braved the almost all-male group and was hungry for God and the Word. Many times she made the drive down from

Santa Barbara to be with us. I once asked her, "Why do you drive that far?" and she said she hadn't had teaching from the Word like that before. So she drove, listened, asked honest questions, grew, contributed, and learned. She was always smiling, very gracious, compassionate, and sincerely interested in other people's welfare above her own—just a joy to be around.

Andrea developed cancer the year after we met. The last conversation I had with her she was asking for advice on solid Christian Bible teachers that had podcasts that she could listen to after her chemo treatments. Today we grieve . . . but Andrea does not. She is whole and complete and in the presence of her Savior, the One in Whom her soul delighted.

Because of sin, death comes to all mankind. Death will also come for you. Jesus defeated death and the grave to secure eternal life for YOU, and Christians don't fear death any longer. Are you ready for your appointed time with death? Have you believed in Jesus and repented of your sins? I know this is what Andrea would most want me to share:

"Brothers and sisters, we do not want you to be uninformed about those who sleep in death, so that you do not grieve like the rest of mankind, who have no hope. For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in Him. According to the Lord's word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left until the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord Himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them, in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever. Therefore encourage one another with these words"

(I Thessalonians 4:13-18, NIV).

It was exciting to start off the New Year with some dear friends that I have been praying for daily, 3 to be exact, attending church here at Cornerstone for the first time! One of them has been attending the Bible study every week as well, which has been a blessing. had served on a mission's board together. He came over and asked me, "Do you have a need?" "Yes," I replied. He didn't ask me how much. He reached into his pocket and gave me several large bills—which paid the tax and more! We talked for a moment, and then he left.

My mind was racing. How could this be true? No one knew where I was. <u>No one but the Lord, that is</u>! I leaned back against the wall with tears streaming down my face. Verses like Philippians 4:19 filled my mind. God had once again proven Himself true to His promises. Praise for Him filled my heart and mind. However, His answers to my prayers are more often *quiet* than *dramatic*, and oftentimes He answers my prayers differently than what I pray for, but He is always *faithful* to His Word.
