While at our Tenebrae experience on Friday night, April 14, I was sitting in the sanctuary alone praying. During this time of reflecting on and thanking God for the incredible sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, my mind kept thinking of a passage in the Old Testament book of Ezekiel. The passage, recorded in chapter 37, is the vision Ezekiel had of a valley full of dry bones. After about thirty minutes of my mind frequently

coming back to this passage, I turned to that passage reading it with the question: what might God be wanting to teach me?

While reading the text, my mind turned to the possible dry bones in my life—the areas of my life where there is little or no life of God present. Some of my dry bones could be when I lack the desire to spend time in prayer or time in God's Word. It could be when I am not motivated to share my faith with people in my life who are far from God. It could be when I am unwilling to forgive someone for a wrong they have committed against me. It could be when I place my own desires over serving others. It could be when I ignore what I know God wants me to do. It could be .....! I discovered the list could be long.

The good news of the Ezekiel dry bones vision is the clear message God was giving

Ezekiel—that He had not forgotten the Jews. Even though they currently were in captivity living in Babylon, God would once again breathe His life into them, and they would come alive in Him. A key concept God tells Ezekiel right before the vision is this:

"I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow My decrees..."
(Ezekiel 36:26-27, NIV).

So my question for you is this: What might be the dry bone areas in your life? Where might you need God to breathe his life into you?

# Reflections

Dear Family,

We live in a tumultuous world. There are many situations in life which we don't understand, and we are bothered by this.

We like to know where we're headed and how we're going to get to our destination. Surprises not only catch us off-guard, they alarm us. What are we to do? Well, we can do what Abram did in Genesis 12:1-9. He placed his faith in God. (Read those verses now.)

I've tried to put myself in Abram's "shoes" when reading this passage. The Lord was asking him to leave everything that was familiar to him: his family, surroundings, all the comforts of home. This was huge. But along with this, no physical road map

was placed in his hands whereby he could "double check" how he was doing.

Wow! With all the "unknowns" which were out there, why would he even venture out on such a project? Simply stated, he believed that the Lord Who called him to such a venture would lead him in this venture. Abram fleshes out the truth in Hebrews 11:6 which says:

"And without faith it is impossible to please God, because anyone who comes to Him must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him" (NKJV).

Abram, whose name was changed to Abraham, is listed in




the roll call of faith in Hebrews 11. Along with Abel, Noah, Jacob and Moses, his life was pleasing to the Lord because he dared to <u>rest</u> his life in God's Hands.

Why? Because he realized that the Lord knew all the *twists* and *turns* he would encounter along the way, therefore he could trust Him. Verse 8 says:

"By faith Abraham, when called to go to a place he would later receive as his inheritance, obeyed and



"Jesus Is Lord"

We remember the outrageous demand made by the disciple we call Doubting Thomas (John 20:24-29): "Unless I see in his hands the mark of the nails, and place my finger into the mark of the nails, and place my hand into his side, I will never believe" (v. 25). But when we read the context of this verse, we get a different picture, for, in the end, he is not Doubting, but Worshiping and Believing Thomas.

The same Thomas who made that outrageous demand also made an audacious proclamation: "My Lord and my God!" In response, Jesus acknowledges his belief: "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed" (v. 29). This one who had been dead stood before him and issued a challenge: carry out your outrageous demand; put your fingers in the holes. He saw Jesus and knew Jesus as Lord.

Philippians 2 tells us that the Father exalted this Jesus and gave him the highest name. This one who is the

Suffering Servant of Isaiah 53 is the Sovereign Lord of Revelation 19. He is Lord of all, and this name, Lord, describes both character and function. Lord is the sort of person that Jesus is. Lord is also what Jesus does: everything is subject to him, and every part of reality is his concern. Before him, every knee will bow, whether that bowing is the heart's deepest desire or greatest repulsion.

The Nicene Creed declares that Jesus is very God of very God from eternity. He is eternally divine, but his resurrection, ascension, and enthronement clearly proclaim his lordship. And we finally see. Before this one every knee bows. Before this one we, his people, worship.

As those redeemed by his blood and made alive by his life, Christians are called to live a life centered on him. Every moment can be filled with proclamation, and every act can be worship. Our audacious proclamation, made through word, action, and attitude, is that Jesus is Lord of everything and everyone.

- Seeds from a grapefruit, orange, lemon or tangerine
- a flower pot
- र्टे soil

#### How to:


Soak the seeds in water overnight.

Fill the flower pot with soil. Plant 3 or 4 seeds about half an inch deep.

Keep soil moist. Water once or twice a week.

Keep pot in a warm. bright place.

The seedlings will sprout in about 8 weeks. Leave only the strongest plant in the pot. It will grow into a little tree with dark, shiny leaves.

# From the Guptas of the Hindustan Bible Institute ~ Recap of 2016

The year 2016 began with efforts to serve the millions of people in our city who were affected by the flood...what a privilege to serve God and people!

In April, I (Bobby) was diagnosed with a case of severe sepsis, was hospitalized, and still am slowly recovering. Praise God, He is healing me and I am able to serve again.

*Linnett*: Along with supporting the passion and burden of discipling the nation, continues to work with women and children. A group of women come faithfully to study the Word, fellowship, pray and serve together to touch lives. The special dynamic is that some are from different faith backgrounds, and they sincerely shine God's light to their non-believing relatives and friends....

*Mythraie*: Our daughter sensed the Lord moving her overseas. She currently serves at a community centre in Spain. She and her team primarily serve immigrants from N. Africa...she is learning Spanish and adapting to a new culture. Linnet and I were glad to spend a week with her...and got a glimpse of her life.

Sushil did a splendid job serving the Lord through HBI Global Partners as its National Director. God has used him in many ways to connect with partner churches and new churches to mobilize them for world missions...one exciting thing is that he is taking HBI Global Partner's "beyond India." The countries of Nepal, Indonesia, China, Singapore and Philippines appear to be great potential.... He is trusting God for support.

*Deepak* had a huge transitioning. After working with UPS for 14 years, he moved to work with Michelin Tires... He spent two weeks with us in India and he has a huge heart to help the children. He not only supports the mission, this year he put a big smile on the faces of our [orphanage] children in getting them a set of new clothes. He certainly has the gift of mercy and a servant heart.

On the Mission Field: from Effectiveness to Excellence and the Beyond

We were able to see the hand of God extend our territories as new doors opened during 2016. God opened the door for us to enter into Moreh in **Manipur**. Moreh is projected to be a smart city. It is bordering the country Myanmar, the gateway to Asia! God has helped us identify and buy land to build another regional training center.

In 2016 a door was opened for me to minister for new networks in **China**. I met with a group of 32 house church leaders who represented a little over 100 churches from 6 provinces of China. I was able to give them a vision for discipling the nation with an example of what is happening in India. I also taught them the Discovery Bible study method and the response was incredible. They could not stop interacting with each other and saw the simplicity of the process and agreed that this method can be followed by anyone in the church.

God has opened the door in **Nepal** through the earthquake relief and rehabilitation work. The Leaders' Conference we had in August led us to prayerfully consider working in Nepal towards discipling the whole nation to Christ by equipping indigenous leaders for church planting and church mobilization. God enabled us to identify 5 leaders who will form the "HBI Nepal" Team with a vision to see that there is a discipling church in every village of the nation, a training center in every district, a Bible College in every state and every Christian family in Nepal releasing at least one child for the mission of God.

My visit to **Indonesia** was to be part of a Higher Education Conference in June of 2016. It really opened up several doors to connect with various universities to consider partnering. One way we would like to partner with them is sending some of our young ladies and men from HBI Children's ministry to be trained through a dual degree program that offers an Arts Degree and a Teacher's Training in 4 years. The students who are training through this dual degree program will commit to come back and serve as teachers in our Christian Day School in India.

We want to thank you soooo very much for your valuable prayers, encouragement, support and partnership. We truly value your friendship, love and care. We appreciate your investment in our lives and ministry.

went, even though he did not know where he was going" (NKJV).

Yes, Abraham obeyed God. Have you noticed that obeying God presents us with a choice? After seeking His will in a matter, we can either obey what He reveals to us OR do what seems best to us. My prayer here is, "Dear Lord, help me to obey You rather than following what seems right to me!"

Obeying God's leading in our lives also has a practical application for us. It delivers us from worry. You see, if God knows what is best for us, which He does, He will get us from point A to point B as we continue to follow His leading. Proverbs 3:5-6 says:

"Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways acknowledge Him, and He shall direct your paths" (NKJV).

I have a confession to make: "I'm descended from a long line of worriers, and this has caused unrest in my life." More and more, by God's grace, I'm learning that our Lord can be fully depended upon in every situation of life. Praise Him!




