Once a year those of us who follow Jesus, and even some who are not followers of Jesus, celebrate a miracle of gigantic proportions. That miracle is Jesus Who was buried in a tomb on a Friday afternoon and walked out of the tomb on Sunday morning. The obvious conclusion from this is that Jesus is more powerful than

even death itself. For us mere humans, death is unavoidable—but not for Jesus.

Today, our culture is obsessed with living as long as possible. There are new treatments and products claiming that they can help people live until they are 100+. But no one is claiming that they can keep people from experiencing death. Everyone dies and everyone knows that. It is an undisputable fact.

That is what is so amazing about Jesus. He actually conquered death. So when He says that if you give your life to Him He will adopt you into His family and give you everlasting life, He can actually do that. In fact He is the only One Who can.

In John chapter eleven, Jesus says, "I am the Resurrection and

the Life (note: that is what He proved by walking out of the tomb). He who believes in Me will live, even though he dies; ... " (v. 25). Even if you have been given eternal life by Jesus, someday you will most likely physically die. But that death is simply a transition from your temporary life here on earth to your permanent eternal life with Jesus in heaven. That is what Easter tells us Jesus has to offer. That is not only good news it is great news.

Let's celebrate our resurrected life in Christ this Easter. Join us this Sunday evening, March 25, for our Easter Concert; Friday, March 30, for our Tenebrae service, a self-directed time to reflect on the death of our Savior; and Easter Sunday, April 1, for a very special time of celebrating Christ's resurrection and our eternal life in Him.

Reflections by Pastor Rog

Dear Church Family,

Periodically my mind goes back to when I was a boy attending Sunday School and many wonderful memories flood my mind—memories of God's people who served Him amid great difficulties. They are men and women who serve as a wonderful example to us today. One of those people is Joshua. Remember him? Upon Moses' death he, under God's direction, was to lead the nation of Israel into the Promised Land. What a tremendous challenge! Following in Moses' footstep was hard enough in itself, but then taking this host of people into a land filled with enemies would discourage anyone but for God being with him.

I'm so thankful that our Heavenly Father not only is always there for us, but that nothing takes Him by surprise or is too hard for Him to deal with. In saying this, His words to Joshua at this difficult time in his life brings encouragement to us. In Joshua 1: 5-6, the Lord said to him:

"No one will be able to stand up against you all the days of your life. As I was with Moses, so I will be with you; I will never leave you or forsake you. Be strong and courageous, because you will lead these people to inherit the land I swore to their forefathers to give them."


The Lord not only knew what Joshua and the Israelites would face as they entered this new land, He also knew the <u>questions</u>, <u>doubts</u>, and perhaps even the <u>fear</u> that was welling up inside of Joshua. How do we know this? We know this because the words "Be strong and courageous" are seen in vv. 6, 7, 9, and 18. In fact in verse 7, the Lord tells Joshua "Be strong and very courageous." [emphasis mine]



How thankful I am that our Lord is always there for His children.

Now, some might say, "That's good for Joshua, but how about me? Is the Lord there for me as well?" Yes, my friend, He is. Notice please how the Lord encouraged Joshua. In verse 6, the Lord assured Joshua that He would use him to divide the Promised Land among the people of Israel. Translation: GOD ALWAYS KEEPS HIS PROMISES. In verses 7 and 8, God implored him to know His teachings so that he would not deviate from them. And here we find the encouragement to face life's difficulties as they would seek

"Ingrancy--True Truth"

Let's say you've headed out on a driving trip across the country. You have your trusty map-app in hand, stops are all planned out, and the car is packed. All goes well for the first couple of days. On the third day, you arrive at a crossroads and take the one the app says leads to your next stop. You end up on the "shore" of a swamp. This is not on the map. The map says this is a cute bed and breakfast. The map was mostly true. But not today. Truth is important.

Inerrancy refers to the truth of the original transcripts of Scripture. It says that Scripture is true, conforming to reality and speaking the truth in everything it affirms. Scripture is not false. It conforms to reality. It is the true, written word of God. A correct understanding of the truth in Scripture requires proper interpretation, using appropriate bible study methods and assumptions. At a minimum, these tools and assumptions include considering the whole of Scripture and approaching the text with the assumption that God's Word does not contradict itself.

God always speaks truth, so his Word is truth, and he himself is a sufficient basis for the assumption of biblical inerrancy (Hebrews 6:16-18). God never lies (Titus 1:1-2). Scripture follows the same rules that it makes for prophets. The Old Testament set strict criteria for those who spoke for God. First, even if a prediction took

place, the person making this prediction was not to be followed if he encouraged listeners to follow other gods (Deuteronomy 13:1-51). Second, those who spoke for God were to declare only what God himself had said. If what they declared did not occur, the declaration was not from God (Deuteronomy 18:20-22). Just as a prophet of God must always speak that which is proved true, so also Scripture always speaks that which is true. The Scripture claims this truth and authority for itself (2 Timothy 3:14-17).

Our life in Christ is a journey. We have companions and spiritual leaders along the way, but Scripture is the only true and completely trustworthy map. We must put forth every effort to understand this trustworthy map and follow it alongside our brothers and sisters as we journey together to becoming like Christ.
