On behalf of myself, Pastor Rog, Karla and Matt, let me say thank you so very much to our church family for your generous Christmas gift. It was such an encouragement to us!

Back in 1855, J. Hudson Taylor did a radical thing—he adopted traditional Chinese dress as he ministered in China. Few had taken such a bold step prior to this time. Hudson Taylor knew that he had to break down all the walls he possibly could between him and the Chinese in order to gain a hearing and reach them with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

In God's infinite love and mercy, He knew that to redeem people, He had to set aside His glory and take the form of humanity. He gave up the luxuries of heaven for a season in order to reach us-the lost. Not only did He take on human form but He also humbled Himself, allowing His creation to put Him to death on the cross. Jesus explains His mission in Mark 10:45: "For even I, the Son of Man, came here not to be served but to serve others, and to give My life a ransom for many."

Clearly people matter to God; you matter to God. You matter so much that God was willing to do

something very radical, like Hudson Taylor, in order to reach you with His love and grace.

We who strive to serve Jesus Christ and minister in His name are wise to follow His example, as Hudson Taylor did. We need to be willing to set aside a tradition or social protocol in order to help us break down walls that block us from effectively sharing the Good News of Christ with the lost. This requires a surrender to God on our part, putting aside our preferences and rights, and staying focused on God's priorities.

May we care enough for the lost to tear down any walls that are keeping us from expressing the Good News of His amazing love and grace.

Thank you for all of your support to the Loaves & Fishes ministry. God and you have blessed this ministry continually month after month.



TFB Academy "Revelation-God Unveiled"

The revelation of God's power and divinity surrounds us, for nature reveals these (Romans 1:20). We watch waves crashing upon the shore and tides flowing in and out, giving us glimpses of God's power. We learn math that echoes God's orderliness and beauty. We gaze upon a newborn infant, and our hearts leap at the reflection of God's divinity in this tiny human form. The revelation of God is all around us, but this general

revelation, given by nature, does not tell us everything God wants us to know. His power and divinity are crucial, but he also wants us to know who he is and what he desires for us. God gave us special revelation, namely Scripture and the incarnation of Christ, to communicate this truth. Last year we studied the doctrine of Christ; this year we focus on Scripture.

- Scripture reveals God's nature. It shows us that God is self-existent, eternal, steadfast, all-knowing, unique and pure, correct, good, love, in charge, all-powerful, and always present.
- Scripture reveals God's will. From the laws and prophets of the Old Testament to the commands and instructions of the New, Scripture tells us what God expects and requires of his people.
- Scripture reveals the good news of salvation. In it we see God telling his people Israel that they will be his people and he will be their God. We see him declare himself as the God who delivered his people from slavery and oppression in Egypt. We see the Savior foreshadowed as the Prophet, Priest, and coming King. We see the life, teaching, and people of this Savior, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world.

The revelation of God is all around us, but, this general revelation, given by nature, does not, tall us everything God wants us to know.

So, what is our proper response to the revelation of God, both general and special? Let's return to Romans 1 for some insight. The foolish see nature's revelation, but do not give God honor. But we shall. The foolish do not give thanks to the Creator. But we shall. The foolish become futile in their minds. But we shall become fruitful. The foolish trust their own minds and hearts. But we shall seek and trust the Spirit and his illumination of God's revelation. The foolish choose to worship nature. But we choose to worship God and God alone.

This is what Scripture reveals.



From Tim Hardy with Frontiers

Over the past month I have been asked the same question quite a few times, "Tim, do you like what you do?" As I have responded to the direct question and to the underlying questions that this presupposes, it has caused me to process the work of mobilization and the role in which I play.

I love the opportunity to challenge people with the mission of God, understanding His story, viewing all people through the beautiful reality that all men are created in God's image, loving people by seeking to know their story, and the continued role of casting vision to be active participants in His Mission.

Do I like what I do?

Yes!

....but it's really hard. Many days that is a huge understatement.

In this ministry, I am inviting people to build relationships with Muslims, to extend Christ's love to them, to cast a larger vision for the countless Muslims in the world that do not have access to the truth. Simple enough, right? But the reality is much deeper, much more complex. I am asking people to reach out, to love, to extend themselves to build something, to be available. But the direction is towards a people we don't understand, a people who are different: a seen enemy, a violent foe, someone to oppose, not someone to create with. Moving beyond fear is much easier said than done.

It is so easy to love people who are like us. But why is it so difficult for us to love people who are different?

Islam is one of the fastest growing religions in the world. 1.6+ billion strong, its followers span the world (and even across the street) and comprise close to 25% of the world's population. For centuries there has been conflict between Christianity and Islam. This ongoing conflict has fueled negative perceptions, fears, and emotionally charged interactions between Muslims and Christians today. Adding to this, our ever-present news and social media platforms continue to set the stage for a wide variety of feelings, promoting fear, hatred, and misunderstanding.

Muslims live in our communities, work with us, attend our schools, and capture the headlines every day. In the midst of this, nearly half of Americans say they do not know a Muslim personally. How should Christians respond to Muslims and adherents of other religions in America? How are we, as followers of Jesus, supposed to relate to Muslims? What attitudes should we have for people who are different from us? How do we respond to people we don't understand? How do we reach out and build relationships with people we might fear?

We read in Scripture "perfect love casts out fear," but why do so many of us live out "perfect fear casts out love"?

I am praying that in 2018 we will see some more breakthroughs.

As 2018 begins, I want to say thank you for coming alongside our ministry. Your support and encouragement is the fuel that we need to continue to be able to witness to and love the Muslim people.



We had the opportunity to participate with friends (some old and some new) in Peace Training provided by Two Faiths One Friendship. This was a great opportunity to learn and understand, explore our similarities and differences, and to develop a foundation for friendship. We are hoping to continue to grow in this in 2018.

Spirit, not only strengthen our ministry amongst us, but they send a message to others who, as of yet, don't believe in Jesus that He is real and that He desires to work in their lives as He has done in ours.


