Reflections by Pastor Rog

Dear Church Family,

How different our lives would be if we did not have God's Word to give us guidance in our daily lives. I shudder even to consider the thought! Our Heavenly Father knew how we would stray from Him if left to our own plans and self-will so He graciously made available to us His mind, heart, and will so that we might listen to Him and stay close to Him. God's Word is holy, practical, energizing, strengthening, and personal. Think of it, in His Word our Lord not only shares His thoughts with us but His **love**. Our God is a wonderful **Heavenly Father**—protecting us and always personally involved in our lives.

The book of the Psalms has always been special to me, for in it I find the **attributes** of our

Heavenly Father vividly displayed. Psalm 34:17-18 tells us:

"The righteous cry out and the Lord hears them; He delivers them from all their troubles...the Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit."

Let's face it, at times the sorrows of life can weigh heavily upon us and our strength is all but stripped away. Who is there to help us? Thankfully, **He** is.

In one such difficult situation, David wrote:

"This poor man called, and the Lord heard him; He saved him out of all his troubles. The Angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him, and He delivers them" (Psalm 34:6-7).

There is **Someone special** mentioned in verse 7. It is *the Angel*



of the Lord. This is a phrase that appears only three times in the Psalms (35:5-6). The Lord Jesus appeared on several occasions in the Old Testament in this form (e.g. Exodus 3:2; Judges 2:1-4; 1 Chronicles 21:16-18).

Think of it, not only has God promised to deliver His people, He has promised to give them the *Deliverer*! Jesus Himself draws near to the believers in their fear.

You might be in such a situation right now, but please know this—your *Deliverer* is with you. You are not alone!

Relevant Scripture: 1 Peter 2:4-10 (with Exodus 19:1-6); 1 Peter 4:7-11; Revelation 1:4-8

"But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light" (1 Peter 2:9, ESV).

We live in an increasingly divided and irreligious culture in which people are ever more in need of good news and real connection with something bigger than themselves. God is good news, and he definitely offers something bigger. How can we help?

Kingdom of priests. God has formed the church as a kingdom of priests, a community of persons who spend their lives offering sacrifices to God and proclaiming his excellence. We, the church, are being built into a spiritual house so that as priests we might demonstrate God before others and bear others before God in prayer.

We offer sacrifices. We offer sacrifices to God as individuals and community, serving as he sees fit and distinguishing ourselves as servants who are seeking to know and obey him. We offer praise to him, worshiping through the voices of our various cultures. We offer our material wealth to him, supporting our local church and our sisters and brothers in Christ.

We proclaim. As those whose home is God's presence yet who sojourn here, we are called to live in God's ways so that others might see our good deeds and praise our Father. In our gatherings, this means ministering to one another with everything we are for the good of the community and the glory of God. It means recognizing the South Bay as the home base for our dispersed priestly work. It means focusing on Jesus and his priorities amidst a politically divided and post-Christian culture that makes our work as priests difficult, yet ever more important.

Why this matters. Each believer and each local church is called to use their God-given abilities and ministries to serve one another for the glory of God. As TFB works toward health, it is crucial that all the believers in this local church live out their work as priests, both in the gathering and in the dispersing.

"To him who loves us and has freed us from our sins by his blood and made us a kingdom, priests to his God and Father, to him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen" (Revelation 1:5b-6, ESV).

You will need:

- ঠ seeds from a grapefruit, orange, lemon or tangerine
- a flower pot
- र्टी soil

How to:


Soak the seeds in water overnight.

Fill the flower pot with soil. Plant 3 or 4 seeds about half an inch deep.

Keep soil moist. Water once or twice a week.

Keep pot in a warm, bright place.

The seedlings will sprout in about 8 weeks. Leave only the strongest plant in the pot. It will grow into a little tree with dark, shiny leaves.

Thomas, a Swiss friend from many years ago emailed last fall and asked if his 19-year-old son [Daniel] could come stay with us for a month before his service in the Swiss Army. Thomas came 2 summers ago and spent time with us and other AIA families in the early 1990's.

His son, Daniel, arrived in early March and will be with us and other families until the end of May. Since Daniel's arrival, we've heard tales of his dad's experiences in America. Little did we know the impact our lives had on Thomas. We are thankful to hear these stories, and it makes us want to be more intentional in all we do and say.

Lord willing, in the days ahead I will be with two different teams of Kazakh junior wrestlers here in the US. The first group will be in Ohio, and I'll help my director Rob as he hosts them. Having a team in the US is always a great opportunity to show them through both word and deed who Christ is. We [were] together April 19-26.

The second group is applying for visas to the US If they receive visas, they will come to Missouri, and I will host them for several days before going with them to Chicago. Again, this is a great time to expose them to the Gospel through hospitality and sharing God's word.

In February I attended the regional wrestling tournament for the University of Central Missouri and the NAIA national wrestling tournament with guys from Missouri Valley College. I enjoy working with these athletes and have seen many of them grow in their faith. I like mentoring athletes during their college years!

Dom, a wrestler from my UCM Bible study recently started a new group study on the book of Philippians. He invited friends and is excited to be sharing what he knows with other college friends!

In early April, I coached my friend Joey LaValley who graduated from the University of Missouri in 2018. He took part in a friendly match called Brawl at the Border, which was held at Union Station in Kansas City. I'm happy to report that Joey won 10-0! He went with us on the AIA 2018 summer tour to Kazakhstan. Joey is a great young man who uses his gifts and talents in wrestling to bring glory to the Lord! He recently started a Bible study with the wrestlers he trains with in California.

This is the time of year when the push is on to recruit, plan and raise funds for several wrestling projects. I am helping plan the wrestling camps and tournaments for junior and cadet wrestlers in Ukraine and Mongolia as well as a tour to Georgia and Azerbaijan, and I'm helping my friend Giorgo plan a tour to Bulgaria and Moldova. There

are literally hundreds of details to iron out before the month of June. Please pray that the Lord will be working in the hearts of teams who are going and the young wrestlers and coaches we meet in these places. This summer I will go to Mongolia and then on to Georgia and Azerbaijan.

The cost per camper is \$100 for one week of evangelistic wrestling camp in Ukraine. Please pray about sponsoring a few campers and coaches. If you are interested, I can send you the details on where to send donations. For fifteen years we have seen lives changed for eternity because young wrestlers heard the Good News at camp.

Cindi is enjoying meeting with international girls at the local university. They like to come to our house and see how typical Americans live. She is always happy to spend time with the girls and have good, spiritual conversations with them.
