So it went, step, step, ROAR, step, step, ROAR, all the way down the aisle.


As you can imagine, the crowd was near tears from laughing so hard by the time he reached the pulpit.

When asked what he was doing, the child sniffed and said, "I was being the Ring Bear."


A Sunday School teacher asked her little children, as they were on the way to church service, "And why is it necessary to be quiet in church?"



If you had one year to disciple a new Christian, what would you teach?

On one particular day, the prof asked us to create the outline for a curriculum to use with a new believer over the course of a year. After a few moments of pondering, four key areas came to the forefront: story, context, issues, and identity. It occurred to me that if a new Christian

began to understand these four things, he or she would be well on the way to becoming a fully devoted follower of Christ. This month, I will lay out the definition and basic components of each element. In coming months, I will begin to unpack the contents of such a curriculum.



The story includes the storyline of Scripture and our own personal story. The storyline of Scripture is found in the books of Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy, Joshua,

Judges, 1 & 2 Samuel, 1 & 2 Kings, Ezra, Nehemiah, Luke (or other of the Gospels), Acts, and (I would suggest) Revelation. All other books of the Bible fit somewhere along this storyline. As followers of Jesus, our story is a continuation of the story begun in Scripture.

The context includes a deeper look at a Gospel to get to know Jesus and begin to grasp his heart. But our context doesn't stop there, for each of us is embedded in a culture that shapes how we see and understand the world. As Christ followers, we must participate in culture with open, biblically informed eyes.

The issues include the big questions, like the nature of truth and reality, our purpose as humans, and the nature of beauty and value. But it also includes questions arising from our daily lives, questions raised by our joys and struggles, by excitement and boredom, by courage and fear.

The final element, our identity, is the most crucial, for who we are and how we see ourselves shapes all our decisions. There are three key pieces to the identity of a Christ follower: person, in community, and in Christ. As Americans, individual identity is better understood than communal identity, but it is a fact that everyone who trusts Christ is part of his Body, the Church. Church is not something we attend, but is something we are. Deeper still, every Christ follower exists in Christ every moment of life.



#### Kimberly Crest House & Gardens, Redlands July 26 (Tuesday)

Kimberly Crest, a picturesque French chateau-style home built in 1897, is a well preserved example of the Victorian Era in California. The 7,000 square foot, three-story chateau sits on a 6<sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>-acre estate two miles south of downtown Redlands and is enjoyed by more than 11,000 visitors annually.

Originally built by Mrs. Cornelia A. Hill, a widow from New York State, the home was purchased by J. Alfred Kimberly (a co-founder of the Kimberly-Clark Corporation) and Helen Cheney Kimberly in 1905. Their widowed daughter, Mary Kimberly Shirk, lived in the home from 1920 until her death in 1979, and willed it to the City of Redlands.


The house's unique features include a French revival parlor complete with gilt furniture and silk damask wall coverings. Terraced Italian gardens, orange groves and ponds surround this historic landmark home. The lily ponds feature radiant Koi; vivid red, pink and yellow lilies against deep green majestic lotus blossoms; and papyrus.

We will leave the church at 10 a.m. The cost is \$9 for the tour which is 90 minutes long and involves stairs. Bring money for lunch.

Sometimes, as I look back on these situations. I wonder to myself, "How did I not see this need, Lord?" He always seems to say to me, "Rog, your focus is too narrow. You are looking at life as if you are looking in a mirror (considering your own needs and hurts). You need to look at life as if you are looking through a window (noticing the needs and hurts of others). When you do this, you will be looking at others from My perspective." Thank you, Lord.

How can our perspective be changed? By spending time alone with the Lord and allowing His heartbeat to stamp its image upon our hearts. Yes, we need to be like the boy, Samuel, who said, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening" (I Samuel 3:10). And as we "sense" His heartbeat and see others through His eves, our lives will be lived differently.

I don't know about you, but this is my need before the Lord. May this be the prayer of each of us, and, if it is, we will then have the privilege to touch the lives of others for Jesus' sake.




Sonseekers' BBQ and Pool Party Saturday, July 16 11 a.m. ~ 6 p.m.
