"Each Person Actively Expressing a Heart of Worship for Jesus Christ"

God's word has a lot to say on money issues. There are approximately 500 verses on prayer, fewer that 500 on faith, but more than 2,350 verses on money issues. Jesus Christ himself said more about money than any other one subject. We know that eternal issues are more important than money, but clearly with how much Jesus talked about money issues, we should not ignore the important

role money plays in our lives here on earth

I want to encourage growth in our understanding of God's money concepts by sharing three foundational principles:

One, how we handle our money impacts our fellowship with the Lord. Luke 16:11 makes it clear that God will not be able to entrust us with true eternal riches if we incorrectly handle our temporal earthly riches.

Two, *possessions compete* with the Lord for mastery of our lives. Matthew 6:24 makes it clear that there is a struggle within each of us between God and material possessions (mammon). I think our handling of money sometimes reveals an attitude that says, "God, you can be the Lord of my entire life

except in the area of money -I am perfectly capable of handling that myself."

Third, much of life revolves around the use of money. This is a simple reality that we need to acknowledge. Since we do spend much of our time and energy dealing with making and managing our money, it makes sense for us to make it a high priority to learn and apply God's money concepts.

I pray that, by God's grace, we grow towards spiritual maturity in all areas of our lives including the handling of money.

Dear Church Family,

It is amazing what a word of encouragement can do to a person in need. It literally can be a life-changing moment. This is also true of those words which discourage and take us down spiritually and emotionally. Let me present an example of this.

During the Boer War (1899 -1902), a man was convicted of a very unusual crime. He ws found guilty of being a "discourager." The South African town of Ladysmith was under attack, and this traitor would move up and

down the lines of soldiers who were defending the city and do everything he could to discourage them. He didn't use a gun or attack these soldiers . . . he didn't need to. His "gun" of choice was the weapon of discouragement. How sad!

Please notice these **important** words written to Jewish Christians who were wrestling with their faith in Christ:

"But encourage one" another daily, as long as it *it is called today, so that* none of you may be hardened by sins'



deceitfulness" (Hebrews 3:13, NIV). And again in Hebrews 10:25: Let us not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but let us encourage one another—and all the more as you see the day approaching.

Filled shoeboxes are due in the church office **BY NOVEMBER 6, 2011** to allow time to transport them to the collection center.







But, what about...? by Laura Springer, M.Div., Th.M. http://www.facebook.com/ pages/TFB-Sanctify-Academy/ We've all asked the questions; we might as well admit it. Knowing the biblical story is good, for the Bible is God's Word. Understanding our context is good, for we were commissioned to make disciples of Jesus in our world.

But there is more. There are deep, nagging questions: questions that refuse an easy answer, that sometimes don't have an answer (or at least not one that we can--or are willing to--grasp).

Following Christ means facing such issues: the big questions, like the nature of truth and reality, our purpose as humans, and the nature of beauty and value. It means facing the questions arising from our daily lives: questions raised by our joys and struggles, by excitement and boredom, by courage and fear. Following Jesus means looking these issues square in the face and admitting that, all too often, we've no idea what to do or how to respond.

Discipling new Christ-followers requires that we face such questions together, whether they be the reflective, philosophical questions of our more thoughtful moments, or the desperate, heaven-pounding questions forced into our souls by life's struggles.

New Christ-followers--and those of us with some road behind us--must never squelch such questions. Left unacknowledged, they eat away at us, sometimes leading to doubts we cannot get past. Brought out into the open and before the face of our God, they can lead to wonder and worship, even if left with an unsatisfying answer.



But let us not think that questions of the nature of truth and reality, our purpose as humans, and the nature of beauty and value have no answers, for our God speaks to all of these in his Word. We can come to a place of humble understanding: an understanding that provides fodder for developing the godly wisdom of a maturing Christ-follower.

Leo Carrillo Historic Ranch, Carlsbad October 4 (Tuesday)

Hidden in a canyon and surrounded by houses is Leo Carrillo Historic Ranch. This former working ranchero was once owned by actor Leo Carrillo and has been restored by the city of Carlsbad to look much as it did over a century ago. Leo Carrillo Historic Ranch is a 27-acre historic park with hand-crafted adobe buildings, windmills and many other historic structures. We will leave the church at 9:30 a.m. and return at about 5 p.m. The cost is \$10 plus money for lunch.

Glendale Centre Theatre November 12 (Saturday)

We will leave TFB at 11 a.m. on Saturday, November 12, and head for Glendale to have lunch and then go see the musical play "*Seven Brides for Seven Brothers*," which is about a backwoodsman named Adam Pontipee and his new bride Milly. They had agreed to marry despite only knowing each other for a few hours. On returning to his cabin in the mountains, Milly is surprised to learn that Adam is one of seven brothers living under the same roof. "Yes, sweetheart," he answered, "God made me a long time ago."


"Oh," she paused, "Grandpa, did God make me too?"

Feeling their respective faces again, she observed, "God's getting better at it, isn't He?"









He is asking for prayer for himself as he ministers to the lost and works with others to translate God's word to those who need it. He also asks that we keep his family in prayer as they remain in the states. Another of our missionary families shared that their kids had recently gone on a mission trip and were able to work with the Navajo people and share the love of Christ with the Navajo children during children's programs. Also during this summer Mom and Dad were able to work with a camp here in the States and were able to challenge others to step into ministry to the lost. This family has been encouraged by the increased numbers of individuals that God is calling out into the field to minister to the lost. Please continue to pray for this family as they continue to seek to do God's will on the mission field. Again, if you want a name, contact the office. But, remember that God knows who this family is and your prayers for them are encouraged.

I would also ask that you pray for our students. As our children and teens return to school this month, they are returning to a mission field. Please pray that each student would have opportunity to be a witness to those they come in contact with. Pray that they would be bold in standing up for their faith. Pray that they would be willing to bring their friends to church and expose them to the gospel message. Thank you for your continued support for our local and global missionaries. May God bless you as you continue to pray and support.
