



Not, Just, Another Brick

There are three key pieces to the identity of a Christ follower: person, in community, and in Christ. As Americans, individual identity is better understood than communal identity, but it is a fact that everyone who trusts Christ is part of his Body, the Church. Church is not something we attend, but is something we are. Deeper still, every Christ follower exists in Christ every moment of life.

So, if we are all Church, what are our responsibilities to the Head of the Church, Jesus, and to our fellow members of the Body? Ephesians 4:11-16 is a key passage in understanding these responsibilities.

Every member of the Body has a responsibility to the local church and to the global church. The Body grows when the members determine to do what God has formed them to do and when the leaders determine to equip them to fulfill that commitment. Leaders are responsible to equip the members for the work of ministry and to equip them for the building of the Body (4:12). Members are responsible to prioritize unity in Christ and to work properly according to God's design (4:16). All are responsible to aim for unity of faith and knowledge (4:13), know and understand true teaching (4:14), follow the truth in love (4:15), submit to the One Head (4:15), and work to grow the Body (4:16).




According to Ephesians 4, leaders — the offices and persons — are a gift to the church and their ultimate calling is to fully equip the members of the Body under their care. But the gifting to the church does not stop there, for verses 15 and 16 focus on the Body as a whole, saying,

Rather, speaking the truth in love, we are to grow up in every way into him who is the head, into Christ, from whom the whole body, **joined and held together by every joint** with which it is equipped, **when each part is working properly**, makes the body grow so that it builds itself up in love (emphasis mine) [Eph 4:15-16].

In other words, every person-to-community connection is critical and every member has a responsibility. Let us each take up our responsibility.

Glendale Centre Theatre November 12 (Saturday)

Mission Inn, Riverside December 6 (Tuesday)

Fuqua Update

"So how's the house?" "How's the Romanian language coming?" "How's the support coming along?" These are questions that people are asking us—so we will try to give you an update now.

We are currently working through some offers on the house. If all works out well, we will be out of the old Fuqua homestead before Thanksgiving. Pray that all goes well with the process and that God leads us to the next place we should be.

The Romanian language-learning is pretty much on hold until our support gets up to 100%. The good news is that our support is going up. We praise the Lord for 6 new regular supporters since July. We're still lacking around 20%, which amounts to around \$1,750 a month.

New Opportunity — This past August, our

teammates in Europe had a strategy session for working with the Roma. They know the situation in some of the countries, but there are still some countries where we need to know more about the current language situation. One of those countries is Spain. Since Debbie and I speak Spanish, from all of our work in Peru, the team would like us to eventually lead some of the research on how many Roma speakers and how many dialects there are in Spain. We will also want to find out what ministries are

already there, so that we can plan on partnering with those who are already playing key roles in reaching the Roma. Debbie and I are really excited about the possibilities. We would still go to Romania as planned, then after being there for a while, we would follow up on the leads we get through our research. We would be doing research now through the Internet and through contacting various ministries who have ties to Roma work in Spain. But, like our Romanian language work, the research they want us to do will also have to be put on hold until we are getting our full support.

A lot is happening these days with us. We've been having Open Houses, then inspections; we're talking to realtors and going to Open Houses; and we're also thinking a lot about this call to work with the Roma people in Romania. We appreciate your prayers as we keep on listening for God's voice in the decisions we have to make and as we look for His guidance and provision. Let us know if you have any questions or if you would like us to speak to your small group about our future work with the Roma.

- 1. Look to the Lord to <u>strengthen</u> us (Psalm 28:7);
- 2. As best as possible, set aside a <u>specific</u> <u>time</u> for prayer (Psalm 5:1-3);
- 3. When <u>hindrances</u> come, give them to the Lord and keep on praying (Psalm 18:6);
- 4. Don't depend on <u>"feelings"</u> when you pray but rather, pray with <u>faith</u>, trusting Him for all things in accordance with His will (Ephesians 6:16-18).
