Easter Cantata April 1, 6:00 p.m.

On Palm Sunday, April 1, our choir, under the direction of Randy Stager, will present "Once Upon a Tree" by Pepper Choplin. This cantata, narrated by Luke, will take us on a journey, from Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, through the last supper, to his betrayal, to death on the cross and finally, to Easter Sunday, when Christ rises from the tomb!

Passover Seder & Potluck Good Friday April 6, 6:30 p.m.

Join us in the Gym as we participate in an actual Seder as a way to connect with the heritage of our own Christian beliefs and to see how the practices of the ancient world are still relevant to Christianity today.



The Passover Seder Plate (above right) is a special plate containing six symbolic foods used during the Passover Seder. Each of the six items arranged on the plate have special significance to the retelling of the story of the Exodus of the Jewish people from Egypt.

Learn what each food represents to the Jews and taste some of the elements. You will also: >> see how Christ, our Passover, was sacrificed for us; >> see the Lamb of God pictured in the Old Testament and revealed in the New; >> appreciate Communion, its roots in the Last Supper and the significance of God's promise, "When I see the blood, I will pass over you"; and >> have an opportunity to bring family and friends to a clear presentation of the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

If you're adventurous, you can bring a Jewish dish (see Nathan Montgomery for recipe) or just make your own creation for the potluck.

Have you ever noticed the incredible change that occurs in Jesus' disciples after the resurrection? It is amazing!

Before the resurrection they were a combination of doubting, self-centered, arrogant, confused men with very little faith, almost no servant mind-set and jostling for positions of prominence within the group.

But afterwards they shared their faith wherever they went, genuinely developed a humble servant's heart, sacrificed the comforts of life, stayed bold in the midst of persecution, and stayed focused on God's mission

These were men driven in their passion and vision for God's mission. It sure was a change from that day in the Garden of Gethsemane when they ran away, leaving Jesus all alone to face the enemy.

I am thinking we all could use this kind of transformation. I'm unsure how it might look, but I think there would be no mistaking the results. Our excitement for the future would

become infectious, our boldness would increase, our pettiness would disappear, our encouragement of others would blossom, and there would be a consistent flow of people hearing from us the Good News of Jesus Christ.

What those first disciples had that we also have is the reality of a risen Jesus Christ. May this Easter be a time of renewal as we open ourselves to the transforming work of our living Lord.

Dear Church Family,

None of us is immune from the trials and sorrows of life. One man who knew a great deal about these things said this...

"Yet man is born to trouble as surely as sparks fly upward" (Job 5:7).

Yes, Job certainly knew about the heartaches and trials of life that the righteous face.

I must admit that at times when trials come my way, instead of <u>relaxing</u> in God's care, I worry. You know what I mean? It's then that the Holy Spirit reminds me to Whom I belong and His loving

care for me and my situation. \underline{A} simple story underscores my point.

"While walking along the edge of the Dead Sea one day, a man lost his balance and tumbled into adeep section of water. Because he didn't know how to swim, he was panic-stricken. In desperation he began to thrash about, fearing he would drown. After a few minutes, he was completely exhausted and felt he could do no more. Crying out to God for help, he expected the worst. But what a surprise awaited him! As soon as he relaxed, he began to float. In his fear, he had forgotten that the Dead Sea is so full




of salt and other minerals that if a person lies still, he will quickly come to the surface. All he needs to do is to trust himself to the buoyancy of the water."


This simple story has a profound lesson for <u>every</u> anxious believer. God's everlasting arms support us if we but give up our unecessary






\$6 (per person, 3-12)




The purpose of the gospel

Resurrection COUNTDOWN

Make this interactive craft to use as Easter approaches.

What you need:

- An empty egg carton
- Scissors
- Tissue paper (a dark color)
- Pencil
- Bible
- 12 slips of white paper
- Glue
- Marker



What you do:

- 1. Cut the lid and side flaps off the egg carton.
- 2. Lay the carton open-side down on tissue paper.
 Trace and cut out the rectangular shape.
- 3. On the paper slips, write 12 verses from John 12 about Holy Week (including one about Easter).
- 4. Place each slip in an egg cup, in order, starting at the top left and ending (with the Easter verse) at the bottom right.
- 5. Put glue around cups and carton edges. Lay the tissue paper on top.
- 6. Gently mark numbers 1-6 on the tissue paper along the top row and 7-12 along the bottom.
- 7. Before Easter, punch through one cup each day and read the verse.


Smile Awhile!


