Turning our hearts to God.

In just a few weeks we will be celebrating our 100th
Anniversary as the First Baptist
Church of Torrance, making us the oldest church in town. This means that 100 years ago (in 1914), seven years before
Torrance was officially registered as a city, some committed followers of Jesus officially established the first

church in Torrance that they had started in 1911 when they traveled down from Los Angeles on a mission to have a place for people to worship God and follow Christ. We have been doing that ever since, having moved to our current location in 1922.

Our biblical focus for this celebration is taken from Hebrews 12:1-2. Three phrases are our focal point:

One: "surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses," referring to the past generations of the faithful who, even during persecution and tough times, continued in their faith

Two: "let us run with perseverance the race marked out

for us, " referring to our Godgiven mission to make disciples.

Three: "let us fix our eyes on Jesus," referring to our focus being placed on Jesus. He is why TFB exists. He is why we continue to gather, worship and serve. And He is our reward. We need nothing else or more to continue what those Christ followers before us started in 1914.

I look forward to our time together on Saturday and Sunday, September 27 and 28. Mark those dates on your calendar and plan to join us for a great time of thanksgiving, praise and celebration.

Reflections

Dear Church Family,

Have you ever used one of these phrases in reference to yourself: "A sinner saved by grace," or "Forgiven, but not perfect"? These phrases are often found in "church language," but they do not relate a complete understanding of our true identity according to Scripture. Please note what the Apostle Paul says in Romans 8:1-2:

"Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit of life set me free from the law of sin and death."

Paul's favorite phrase to refer to believers in the New Testament is "in Christ." Think

with me — through the miracle of salvation, we have been placed in Christ. This means that when Almighty God sees us, He doesn't just see us as a sinner saved by His grace; He sees us as righteous as the very Son of God Himself. We ask, "Is that because we are that righteous?" Absolutely not! It is because that righteousness (the righteousness of Christ) is what I have been given by the grace of God (Romans 3:21-24). That is who I am now in Christ! That is my true identity.

Ponder this staggering truth: when you and I have been in heaven for ten thousand years, we will not be any more righteous in the sight of God



than we are right now. We ask, "How is that possible?" It is only possible because we are in Christ through faith in His Name for the forgiveness of our sins (Ephesians 2:8-9). Our righteousness before God is not based on our performance for Christ, but our POSITION in Christ. Because we are in Him, there is no condemnation. When we fail Him, our enemy, Satan, rushes in to condemn us. It is at this time we are vulnerable to looking away



"Making Decisions as the Body of Christ"

We make decisions in many different ways. We hold a finger in the air to see which way the culture is heading. We look inside and follow our hearts. We think through the costs and benefits, choosing the decision with the highest payout. We pray and seek God's will.

Each method has some benefit. Cultural context clarifies the relevance of decisions (John 17:14-19). Values and strengths leverage competence and commitment (Ephesians 2:10). Thinking through costs and benefits insures enough resources (Luke 14:28). Founding the entire

process on prayer and worship increases the likelihood of a Christ-centered decision (Philippians 4:6). All these are good and necessary. But in the body of Christ, there is another piece.

"Better decisions are made with a multitude of counselors"

Good decision-making considers experience, knowledge, affections, and God's will, all in the context of community. God created humanity as a people and he called the church as one body (Genesis 1:26-27; Ephesians 4:4, 16). This does not mean every decision is a committee decision; it does mean that every decision includes the community in the decision-making process. Better decisions are made with a


multitude of counselors (Proverbs 15:22). We do this because we are one body, and we do this because we need the perspectives and skills of members of the body.



Two thousand fourteen marks the 40th Anniversary for Rainbow Acres, a mission that TFB supports through Transformation Ministries. Rainbow Acres is a Christian Community in Camp Verde, AZ with a heart that empowers persons with developmental disabilities. It promotes an holistic approach to care that fosters a sense of self-worth through family style living in a loving and accepting community. Job skills, social standards and self-help methods are highly valued, and are taught and encouraged by employees and volunteers motivated by Christian values of love and concern. Rainbow Acres strives to provide every opportunity for residents, called Ranchers, to pursue lives of



David Butler has made Rainbow Acres Ranch his home since its beginning in 1974. In the forty years since his arrival, David has grown crops, done landscaping, and cared for animals. At one time David was responsible for a four-man crew which cared for a herd of 25 goats!

Reader's Digest published a story in 1986, featuring David and his journey from a lonely and moody teenager to a life of purpose and dignity with the help of Rainbow Acres and the dreams of founder Ralph Showers.

Today David's duties include monitoring the local weather and ensuring that the lawns around the administration building and the basketball court are watered as needed.

dignity, purpose and respect.

Like every Rancher at Rainbow, David also has chores to do in his home at Hoover House, where he lives with nine other men and a dedicated team of Caregivers. Although the Ranch property has changed and may look more like a suburban neighborhood or a small community college campus nowadays, there are still animals that need tending. David enjoys doing what he can with the six rabbits that live in the barn area along with horses and dogs.

Two new houses for Ranchers are scheduled for completion this Fall! Aria House is named to honor the love of music shared by the sponsoring Van Dyck family. Its modern décor and artwork will reflect the theme. An unexpected bequest allows the building of a second house at the same time, which saves on construction costs, and the Board of Trustees chose to name it Wagner House, in honor of longtime President and CEO Gary Wagner. A

more traditional theme will be seen throughout this home.

Each of the modern houses at Rainbow includes a Great Room

Aria House which encompasses a dining area and an entertainment center with comfortable seating for residents. Individual bedrooms offer privacy for ten Ranchers, and a suite is also set aside for the Caregivers who rotate in the house.

Aria House will join Koinania, Hoover and Patrick Houses by adding a twobedroom apartment that may be used by staff members, consultants, Rancher families and volunteers. These two homes will bring the total living quarters to

eleven houses and eight apartments!

Rainbow Acres is celebrating its 40th Anniversary this year on Friday and Saturday, October 24 and 25. The weekend will be chock full of wonderful events to commemorate Rainbow Acres' lifetime of service. 





Coming soon: Get ready to Celebrate September 27-28






Invite everyone you know, including past members and attendees, to join in as Torrance First Baptist
