Reflections

Dear Church Family,

Finding direction for our lives is a very important thing, for oftentimes we don't know what to do. Many years ago, I found a little plaque with a saying from President Abraham Lincoln:

"I have been driven many times upon my knees by the overwhelming conviction that I had nowhere else to go."

How very true! But many years before President Lincoln made this statement, another government official was crying out to God because of similar circumstances. David, the King of Israel, said this in Psalms 25:4-5:

"Show me Your ways, O Lord; teach me Your paths. Lead me in Your truth and teach me, for You are the God of my salvation; on You I wait all the day."

Once again, how very true.

Let's face it, when our circumstances are urgent, extreme and bleak, we need to know God's way. But how? David was under extreme duress, as his son, Absalom, had rebelled against him and desired his throne — even his life! What was he to do? Fortunately, he knew what to do, and he cried

out to the Lord for help and direction. It is here that David teaches us that when God leads us in His way, it typically involves three things.

First, there is the issue of what we *want*. Notice, please, that David said, "Show me Your ways, O Lord; teach me Your paths." David desired to be led by the Lord. Many times we don't really want God to show us His ways; what we really want is for Him to approve and affirm our ways. Interestingly, when God, Who knows our hearts, sees that we really want Him to lead, then *HE WILL LEAD US*.


PASTOR'S MEMBERSHIP CLASS Saturday, October 11




Family Fall Fest Volunteers Needed



Or, you can write a check to Samaritan's Purse (note "OCC" on the memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the items inside your shoebox. Remember to Pray for the children who will receive your shoebox gifts.




A promise to the earth

Glory be: Like light shining beyond brightness or weight past lifting, so is God's glory and worth (Exodus 19; 1 Kings 8; Revelation 1). He is worth more of our glory than we can give (Ps 29, 96).

to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost: God is a Trinity; he is one God and three persons. We see the Trinity at Jesus' baptism: the Son was in the water, the Father spoke from heaven, and the Spirit descended like a dove (Luke 3; Ephesians 4): three persons, one God.



As it was in the beginning is now, and ever shall be: From before the beginning of time, God is worthy of glory (John 17). He is worthy of glory in every moment and every circumstance. He is worthy in every moment that is now.

world without end: His worth and his works are from everlasting to everlasting (Psalm 90). There is never a time when our worship can justly be laid aside (Revelation 4).

Amen: As a prayer, the *Gloria Patri* asks God to let our worship bring him glory. As a declaration, it announces our commitment to ascribe glory to Father, Son, and Spirit in all our moments.

The Gloria Patri is an ancient Christian prayer and hymn; as a prayer, it was in use from at least the fourth century and versions of the song from at least the seventh. There are several versions in several languages, including Syriac and Greek. Over the centuries Christians have sung this hymn to declare God and our worship of him.



From our missionaries Ramona & Chuck Shawvers who serve in Mexico

Dear Friends,

Happy Memorial Day weekend and last Sunday of this very rare month of five Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. This won't happen again for more than 800 years. Apparently the Chinese call this the "silver pockets full" month...speaking of which, your generosity and your prayers touch us deeply. Besides your regular support to sustain our ministry, many of you have sent extra donations to help the Baptist Seminary in Mexico City in this time of financial crisis along with extra gifts to International Ministries to help with the all staff gathering. There is so much to thank you for and so much to share with you.

Ramona and I are well and write for the first time from our new home in The City of Puebla (70 miles east) where we have landed following the sale of the seminary apartment buildings in Mexico City. As a consequence of that sale by the legal owner, the seminary has lost much of it operating income. We are now in a major reorganizational process to reduce expenses and re-focus our efforts on equipping church leaders through more cost-effective extension programs. We ask for your prayers in this process as our reduced team has more work than ever. We will be at the seminary this next week working on both administrative and academic restructuring. Our new colleagues, IM Missionaries, Keith and Deb Myers, will play a significant role in future extension programs.

The All Staff Gathering, International Partners Consultation, and World Mission Conference at Green Lake, WI, this past July was an amazing time of inspiration, education, collaboration, worship and fellowship. Words don't come close; what a grand experience. We are grateful to all who made the event possible. Following Green Lake, Ramona and I were able to spend time with our children and their families in Indiana and California. Our wonderful family news is that Silas and Bere are expecting their first child, a boy, in January.

After a month in the U.S., it is a joy to be back in Mexico and back to the work we love. In September we will be focusing on the seminary's reorganization and visiting churches in Chiapas to follow up on very productive regional events last May. In October the churches of CICEM hold their national gathering in Puebla. Following that event we will be visiting communities in Oaxaca, Mexico and Puebla on behalf of the seminary and then in November back to Chiapas for most of the month.

Because your prayers are so powerful, we ask you to bring the following matters to the Throne of Grace:

- 1. Our colleagues Dalia Juarez and Eleazar Perez were involved in an automobile accident returning to Chiapas. Both suffered neck and back injuries. Please pray for their recovery.
- 2. Our beloved colleague, Olivia Juarez, passed away from diabetes-related causes earlier this summer. Please pray for her family, Lazaro, Melquizedec, and Sury as they mourn their great loss.
- 3. Pray for the reorganization of the Baptist Seminary and its future.
- 4. Pray especially for the following churches which are in times of testing: San Juan Cote, Calihuala, Maravillas, and Chacacal.
- 5. Pray for a needed missionary colleague/couple to serve long-term with our churches in Chiapas.
- 6. Pray for our seminary students who are finishing up their thesis work hoping to graduate in December.
- 7. Pray, participate and advocate for the World Mission Offering. Thank you!

The second thing we notice here has to do with our *will*. David not only wanted God's ways and paths, he was willing to follow God's leadership. Do we see it? Without the involvement of the will, the first pebble we encounter on our path trips us up. Why would the Lord show us His way when we are unwilling to follow His way? When David asked the Lord to "lead him," he declares his willingness to submit to God's will. I wonder, are we willing to do this as well?

But then, thirdly, we need to understand that experiencing God's will may require us to *wait*. We don't like that word, do we? In submitting to the Lord's will, David demonstrated his desire and his willingness to let God lead him according to His time table. Help me, Lord!

I don't know where you are in your walk with the Lord, but may you be willing to let these three things which guided David's life guide yours.

Remember, we can depend upon our wonderful Lord. Why? Because He is absolutely *FAITHFUL*.

Gift, Suggestions for Samaritan's Purse Shoeboxes

Toys: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Non-Liquid Hygiene Items: toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.

Accessories: t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), etc.

A Personal Note: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.

Do Not Include: Used or damaged items; warrelated items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.
