# Reflections

Dear Church Family,

As we embark on a new year, we can either dwell on the defeats of the past or rejoice in the grace of God which ministers to us now and through eternity. May we remember that we invite defeat into our lives when we continue to remember what we should forget.

This morning, in my time alone with the Lord, I read the Old Testament book of Lamentations. It is written by the prophet Jeremiah. It is a hard read. The city of Jerusalem—indeed, the entire of Israel—was a heart-breaking sight in 586 BC. The southern kingdom of Judah had sinned against the Lord, and she had been righteously judged and disciplined by Him. The devastation was heavy and the

people were in the grip of utter despair. Along with this, Jeremiah is being taunted by his enemies because he dared to tell the people why God's judgment had fallen upon them (see 3:52-63). The people's treatment of him was deplorable, but thankfully, within this account of sorrow and heaviness, there are moments of great encouragement — moments when God's Word touched Jeremiah's aching heart. And because of this, in the midst of his laments, God reminds him that His love for His people has not diminished nor His character changed. Please notice what Jeremiah says to us in chapter 3:22-24:

"The steadfast love of the



Lord never ceases; His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Your faithfulness.... 'The Lord is my portion,' says my soul, therefore I will hope in Him.'"

And in vv. 55-57, we read:
"I called on Your Name, O
Lord, from the depths of the
pit; You heard my plea, 'Do
not close your ear to my cry



acknowledging His sovereignty, His grace, His faithfulness among so much more.





The "one" theme of Ephesians 4:4-6 assures us that we need to be baptized only once. Yet a relationship with God involves approaching him with a humble heart each day.



- 3. When the paint is dry, peel off the letters to reveal words that explain important Bible truths.

Becoming, Face-to-Face by Laura Springer, M.Div., Th.M

How do we become who we are? How does identity develop? DNA plays a part to be sure, as does upbringing. But a good portion of our identity is built face-to-face. We begin to become who we are when our newborn eyes behold the face of our primary caregiver. As we mature, we begin to recognize other human faces, finally recognizing our own. This recognition is the beginning of self-and-others-awareness, leading to maturity.

Our identity is also shaped by the face of God experienced spiritually and reflected in his Word, his people, and his world. A survey of the term "face" in the Psalms says much about the kinds of shaping that can occur.

- God's face brings good (<u>Psalm 4:6; 22:24; 31:16; 44:3; 67:1; 80:3; 80:7; 80:19; 89:15; 119:135</u>). A look from God's face brings comfort, steadfast love, and deliverance.
- When God's face is turned away we feel forsaken (<u>Psalm 13:1; 27:9; 30:7; 44:24; 69:17; 88:14; 102:2; 104:29; 143:7</u>). More than that, when God turns his face utterly away, we are forsaken and all is lost. Our very existence is threatened because life itself is in him.
- God's face is against those who choose evil (<u>Psalm 34:16; 80:16; 143:7</u>). This is more than the removal of God's pleasure. This is the presence of God's wrath.
- The righteous see God's face and are satisfied (<u>Psalm 11:7; 17:15; 24:6; 27:8; 34:5</u>). In his face, we find wholeness (God's *shalom*). In his face, our needs are met.

It is a sobering thought to realize that we can be the face of God for others. We who care for others' souls must take care to spend sufficient time gazing at the face of God. We must take care to discover and confess the distortions in our identities, leaving those distortions in the care of a healing God, who beholds with love the faces of his children.


### The Good Samaritan

#### From our missionaries, Chuck & Ramona Shawver, in Chiapas, Mexico

Dear Friends,

The passionate death bed plea of a beloved uncle healed Manuel's heart and now he can't stop smiling.

We heard his story when he first went to prison. In a tragic hunting accident, Manuel shot and killed his nephew. He turned himself in and was quickly sentenced to seven years in prison for homicide. The families were devastated and his wife Carmen and their four young sons were left to fend for themselves. They were believers and attended the local Baptist church on a regular basis. Carmen and her boys struggled to survive and the church didn't do enough to support them. Little by little, they stopped attending worship services.

In prison Manuel came close to God and found strength to survive each long and difficult day. While his personal faith grew, he was bitter that no one from the church visited him. Life is hard in the mountain community of El Jardin and time and money for travel to the prison are scarce...and yes, there are always excuses.

After serving four of the seven years, Manuel was released this past June and made the long walk home. The reunion with his

family was a mixture of joy and anguish; a new routine did not include going to church. Pastor Antonio's visits were not welcomed and Manuel made it clear that he was through with the church. Talk of vengeance by some members of the dead boy's family began to circulate in the community. Members of the area drug gang offered Manuel protection if he would join them. And then came news that his uncle was dying in a nearby village.



Several family members were gathered in the home when Manuel arrived. The old man found strength to sit up and talk to the relatives gathered around him He pleaded with them to let go of bitterness, to forgive and be reconciled; to choose to love. Tears welled in Manuel's eyes and he knew the words were meant for him and that God was speaking through his uncle, telling him to return to church. His uncle died a short time later but his words were heeded and Manuel gathered his family the following Sunday for the thirtyminute walk to "Christ Is the Truth" Baptist Church. They haven't missed a service since. As you give thanks this week, include Manuel and his family in your list and pray for them: Manuel, Carmen, Pascual, Humberto, Manuel, Jr., and Pedro.

And Ramona and I will be giving thanks for you. For your generosity, your prayers, your friendship. The seminary is moving forward and we will send a detailed update very soon. Your gifts have inspired our team, and we can never thank you enough. Our hearts are filled with gratitude for the privilege of serving the indigenous peoples of Mexico, for our colleagues and family, for the joy of seeing God at work in people, for grace when churches fail, for hope that we can and will do better!

We love you and pray for God's blessing in your lives and ministries.

for help!' You came near when I called on You; You said, 'Do not fear!'"

DO NOT FEAR! What awesome words of encouragement to hear from God Himself. In spite of all the heartaches which were taking place, and would even continue, the Lord graciously instructs Jeremiah to stop dwelling on his circumstances and turn his eyes upon Him — upon the One Who alone can meet his (and the country's) needs during this time of sorrow, pain, and defeat.

What I take from God's encouragement of Jeremiah is that He would not let go of him or Judah through this time of spiritual pruning and discipline. Why? Because, His love and mercy are steadfast...never ending. Please know this — no matter what comes your way, God will not let go of you. Never! Though you may find yourself in the middle of a storm — even of your own making — He will not turn His back on you. And so, if we need to repent of sin, then let's be honest before Him and repent. And if we once again need to let Him control our lives, let's be humble before Him and yield afresh to His leading. Will He listen to us? Yes, He will. Why? Because He is gracious. He can be trusted to lead us from a time of sorrow to a time of peace. You see, "the steadfast love of the Lord never ceases" (v. 22).
