To make it short, *Blake* is now 38 years old and has lived a wasted life. He's been in and out of jail and currently is incarcerated. Out of the blue, as we say, his mom contacted me. We hadn't talked since the 1980's. As you can imagine, her heart is beyond broken. Blake has been on the street for so long (drugs, gangs, jail, near death experiences), she's almost beyond caring. It was my privilege to reach out to her once again with words of encouragement, God's Word and praver.

It's in times such as these



(when all seems hopeless) that we can come alongside others and remind them that there is One Who truly desires to stand by them and <u>lift</u> them up. <u>His name is</u> <u>Jesus</u>. In thinking of this dear mom, I earnestly desired her to know the truth of Psalm 34:18:

"The Lord is close to the broken hearted and saves those who are crushed in Spirit."

I go to church on Sunday, I stand up during the music and praise time, and I have a Bible app on my phone. I have all my bases covered, right? Maybe not. Try to honestly and thoughtfully ask yourself: "WHAT WOULD IT REALLY TAKE FOR ME TO BE THE KIND OF CHRISTIAN I WANT TO BE?"

If you're having a hard time coming up with something solid, maybe one of these will stand out to you:

1. <u>Personal Discipleship</u> – Is there someone you really respect as a mature Christian that has qualities that you'd really like in your life? Find someone who has a similar spiritual gift set, similar personality, and similar challenges, and meet them for lunch at least once a month.

2. <u>Christian Fellowship</u> – Have regular conversations with your Christian friends where you don't just ask, "How's it going?" Instead, ask them questions centered on Christ, like, "Is there a scripture/sermon/song that you've been thinking about lately?" or "How can I pray for you?"

3. <u>Serving the Body of Christ</u> – Do you have a regular commitment to serve in children's ministry, sing/play on a worship team, or lead/host a fellowship group? No?! Well, get to it! The Body of Christ desperately needs every one of its members, and you need the rest of us!

4. <u>Bible Study</u> – Simply reading the Bible doesn't do anything. What's important is meditating on it, discussing it in a fellowship group, and asking the Spirit of God to teach you how to apply the truth of God's Word in your life.

Did one of these stand out to you? Mentally highlight it. That might be the Holy Spirit's way of giving you some specific, timely direction on how to grow in your relationship with God and with His people. If you're not sure how to do it, ask a pastor, elder, or deacon, and we'll pray with you that God will lay out a clear path for you. He honors those who diligently seek after Him.

"God is All Knowing (Omniscience)" by Laura K. Springer, M.Div., Th.M.

What could happen? It's a question often asked right before we do something foolish. The truth is there are many things that could happen, and we do not know what they are. We can plan and make projections, but we cannot know what tomorrow brings. We can be caught off guard. God cannot be caught off guard.

God's knowledge of reality is limitless. He knows what happens and what could happen. God's knowledge of himself is limitless. He always knows his motivations and purposes; his decisions and actions are intentional. His awareness cannot be hindered, and his attention cannot falter.

God's righteous knowledge perceives and understands the actual about us. Every creature comes before him to be judged (Hebrews 4:11-13). His knowledge increases fear when we sin because we cannot hide from his justice. His knowledge also increases rest, because his discipline can only be understood in the context of his constant, loving attention.


God's compassionate knowledge understands and redeems, even when our hearts do not understand it (1 John 3:19-22). He is tender with us, for he remembers we are dust (Psalm 103:13-14). He knows we forget that salvation covers everything. He knows we tend to see our sin before we remember his mercy and grace. "God's compassionate knowledge understands and redeems, even when our hearts do not understand it."

Christ's experiential knowledge of temptation informs and shapes his knowledge of his people (Hebrews 4:14-16). Because Jesus is God, we may think that it was easy for Jesus to withstand temptation. But Jesus is also fully human. He lived a righteous life on earth by trusting his Father and the Spirit. In reality, Jesus understands temptation more deeply than any other human because only he endured it to the end without ever giving in. He alone has felt temptation's full force, and he understands our plight.

We don't know everything. A quick look at Wikipedia reminds us that there is a good deal more to know than any one human ever could. The good news is that God, the one with limitless love and power, also knows absolutely everything. In him we are safe.

What you need:

- A cookie sheet
 - kie
- White shaving cream
- A wooden craft stick
- Paint (blue and green)
- A straw
- A paper plate

What you do:

1. On the cookie sheet, spray shaving cream in a circle (the same size as the bottom of the paper plate). Smooth it out with the craft stick. 2. Squirt the blue and green paint on top of the shaving cream in loopy, squiggly patterns. Swirl the paint around with the straw. 3. Place the bottom of the paper plate on top of the paint. Press it down gently so the whole plate bottom is covered in paint. 4. Lift up the plate and gently remove excess shaving cream with the stick. 5. After the painting dries, hang it on your wall.

Winter Campout

We visited Carpenteria campground this year for our winter campout after taking a year off and going to El Capitan last year. It was encouraging to have a good number show up, around 25-30 total. Some of the highlights for me was getting to meet Shawn, another recent Ventura County Rescue Mission graduate. Hearing stories of God's redemption,

deliverance from sin/addiction and ongoing sanctification never gets old. It was really good to have him come as well as Taylor and Michael, also from the Mission.

Another treat was getting to spend time talking to [a young man named] Daniel after I shared the message Saturday night. The message was about the commands of Christ that Jesus taught us to teach his disciples, fulfilling the Great Commission. It hit home for him and he wanted to talk about it afterwards. ... He is 21 and a Christian. He is very focused, works a lot and spends his spare time apprenticing to be an electrician. I was able to encourage him to continue on that path as well as knowing that he is welcome at any of our meetings to continue to be mutually encouraged to pursue a life of holiness and obedience to Christ.

Another blessing was getting to meet Tamara . . . who was saved and subsequently freed from drug addiction and eating disorders. Now she works at a center to help others with these exact problems. Her stories of what she encounters on a daily basis with those suffering from these things were heart wrenching. Again it reminded me of all of God's people that day in and day out are on mission, loving others, making an eternal difference in this world.

All in all, a very encouraging time and a time where Christ was shared, the Word was opened, relationships were built and the Kingdom was advanced. Praise Him! Looking forward to the next one already!

Surfer's Meals

We restarted the Surfers Meals at Olas de Carlos Surf Grill in January and it has been very good. Last month we met Taylor through the meal and this month we had Jeremy join us. I was especially blessed by the end of the meal last night when I got to know my friend Michael N. a little bit better (he works part time at Olas). He shared some of his story with Jeremy and I outside after the meal. It was awesome to hear about him serving the Lord by volunteering with troubled youth and youth in general.
