Pom the Pastor's Hear



The story goes that one Sunday a pastor preached on the call of God on our lives to love one another. The

next Sunday he preached on the exact same theme. He preached that same sermon for four Sundays in a row. Finally at the board meeting that week, the Deacons pleaded with him to move on to another topic in his preaching. He said he would once the church family had taken this truth to heart and genuinely had begun to love one another.

At the risk of having someone wish I had written a different *Proclaimer* article, I am reprinting a *Proclaimer* article I wrote just five months ago. Why? Because I believe it is imperative that we remember and experience the truth of what I wrote. So here it is.

Please read it with an open heart and mind for what God wants to say to you.

Jesus was about to go back to heaven, and He told His followers to wait—not to do any ministry yet. Why? Because they needed to receive the Holy Spirit first. Why? Because with the Holy Spirit they would have the power necessary to fulfill their mission.

So it is clear that the power of God through the Holy Spirit is essential for effective ministry. Sure, we can do ministry in our own efforts, but the spiritual impact will be minimal. In fact Jesus said in John 15, the impact will be zero.

Now we know from Ephesians, chapter one, that those who have accepted Jesus Christ as their Savior have the Holy Spirit living in them. So there is no need for us to wait as they did in Acts one. But also in Ephesians we read, "be filled with the Spirit" which literally is translated "keep on being filled with the Spirit." Why? Because it is only when the Holy Spirit is leading and

working through us that our lives and other's lives are spiritually impacted and changed. That is why Paul says in First Corinthians, chapter two, that he came not in persuasive speech but with "a demonstration of the Spirit's power." He goes on to say, "so that your faith may not rest on men's wisdom but on God's power."

Because of this, I am asking us all to look beyond the church calendar full of activities, look beyond the efforts and energies we give to ministry, and look to be filled with, led by and empowered by God's Holy Spirit—so that our faith rests on God's power at work and not our efforts. Then and only then will our lives count for eternity. Then our efforts will truly make an impact for God's kingdom.

I am confident that if you are a child of the living God, that is your heart's desire. May that desire be fulfilled in your life and mine.





There are family programs, fellowship groups, local and global outreach, and performing arts and music ministries. Literally, on paper, we've got a great body of believers here at TFB! And there's nothing wrong with that...

Unless you think that all the roles of ministry at TFB are taken, reducing you to being a passenger. Titled ministers can "open the doors" and maybe bring food, but the core of relational ministry is the prayerful speaking of God's Word from one person to another. The pastors and staff could put on a thousand programs a year, and not see anyone grow spiritually.

"God is Correct,
(Righteous)"

"But it's not fair." Many a parent and caregiver has heard this plaintive cry from the mouth of a child. Many an employee has felt it when someone else gets the raise or promotion that we thought we deserved. We humans do not need to learn fairness and justice, at least when it comes to our felt needs. Inside we're all fairness czars, and our righteousness is too easily selfish.

God's righteousness is never selfish but is always expressed from justice and love. God highly values and accomplishes justice (Psalm 99:4). His sovereign rule and holiness form the context in which he exercises righteousness (Psalm 99:1-2).

God punishes evil and rewards good. He does what is right, and he cannot be influenced to do otherwise. He is Lord of all, and he has the power to do what he wills. He always acts in keeping with his covenant, for righteousness is the exercise of justice in the context of community loyalty (Psalm 99:4d). God is just and fair in his dealings with his people, and he expects his people to be just and fair in their dealings with one another. He forgives wrongs



against himself and takes action when others are wronged (Psalm 99:8). Our proper response is to lift him up (exalt) and bow ourselves down (worship) (Psalm 99:5, 9).

To be righteous is to do the right thing and not be convinced to do otherwise. Easy to say; hard to do. Our hearts are often against us and draw us away. Our culture presents a multitude of pleasant temptations that make us question the worth of righteousness. The world system tries to conform us to its ways and do us harm. Satan tries to trick and trip us. But he who is in us is stronger than he who is in the world (1 John 4:4).

"Exalt the Lord our God, and worship at his holy mountain; for the Lord our God is holy" (Psalm 99:9, ESV).

Make an Instrument of Praise



You will need:


- ✓ 2 paper plates
- dried beans
- pieces of crepe paper streamers or ribbon
- ✓ glue—thick craft type
- **stapler**
- crayons or markers

How to make:

1. Decorate the outside rounded part of each plate.



- 2. Lay one plate face up on the table. Put glue / around the edges.
- 3. Place a small handful of beans in center of plate.
- 4. Lay crepe streamers or ribbon at one side so the ends are in glue. Put more glue on top of crepe or ribbon ends.
- 5. Lay the other plate on top, face down. Hold edges together until glue sets. If needed, staples can be used around
- edges also.
- 6. Shake or tap your instrument and sing.

The month of February was quite a month. All our old linoleum which was splitting apart and coming loose in the Chapel, halls, and dining room, has been replaced with a beautiful wood-grain flooring and the DOH's badly worn carpet has been replaced with a grade of carpet made to last. But none of this would have been possible if it weren't for a very generous, anonymous donation to BLM /DOH. This foundation has consistently donated to the Mission so we can improve it.

Added to this, ...our two-door reach-in refrigerator quit and we faced a repair that was about \$4,000. Then our old three-door refrigerator which has constantly been bleeding us of our dollars and cannot meet the Health Department's temperature requirements, needed to be replaced.

But our cook, Mr. Ben, went out to his contacts and told them about us and what we do, and the bargaining started. Bottom line, Ben was able to get 2 new three-door reach-in refrigerators for a little over \$5,000.00; a greatly reduced price. And where did we get the 5K? After we had the floors done and we paid our bills, we still had some money left over from the above anonymous donation which was enough to pay for the refrigerators. Only a loving God could have orchestrated this so perfectly.

We, the staff, profusely wish to thank those of this unnamed foundation for their love of our displaced, lonely, broken friends that we get to serve, because they chose to serve through their generosity.





realize that the fruit contains seeds for <u>more fruit</u>, and these seeds are sown in the ground. In our Scripture above, James teaches that "the fruit of righteousness is sown <u>in peace</u>." Do we realize that as we share God's fruit with others, they are able to "catch" and receive God's blessing, and as a result, bear fruit themselves?

May we never forget that our lives are all about sowing and reaping. Who we are is how we live, and how we live is what we sow. We then understand that what we sow determines what we reap. Here's the spiritual truth James desires us to understand: If we live in <u>God's wisdom</u>, we will sow the fruit of righteousness, gentleness, and mercy within.

I don't know about you, but I need to ask myself this question: "What kind of seed am I sowing, and is it pleasing to the Lord and beneficial to others?" 
