Allowing the grace of God to flow through you

This summer our VBS theme was "Walk This Way." It was an exciting time with 60+ kids learning from the book of Acts about living life God's way.

As I watched children come each evening, I was reminded of what Jesus said in Matthew 19. He said, "Let the children come to Me. Don't stop them, for the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to such as these" (14).

Jesus has a special place in His heart for children and so do we here at TFB. I saw that during VBS with the dozens of volunteers that faithfully came each evening ministering to these children. ## Reflections by Pastor Rog

Dear Church Family,

Have you noticed how hard it oftentimes is to be still—to be quiet? Let's face it, for many of us, it's not easy. We allow our minds to race from one problem to another—trying to come up with plausible solutions to those life situations which bring stress into our lives. We are concerned about what will come next or grieving about the past. Sound familiar?

Thankfully, the Lord has the answer for us. It's found in Psalm 46:10:

> "Be still and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth!"

This passage is very encouraging to us. The phrase "be still" literally means, "take your

hands off! Relax." In this psalm, we see some pretty heavy things which the nation of Israel could experience in the days and years ahead (vv. 2-3), but nowhere will you find that God's people are to be fearful or anxious about what could take place. On the contrary, God assures His people that He is their refuge and strength (v. 1); that He is an ever present help in trouble (v. 1); that He is their fortress (vv. 7-11); therefore there is no reason for His people to fear (v. 2). What this psalm tells me is that I need to place my trust in Him when "life" isn't working out and the answers I'm seeking haven't come into focus yet. Thankfully, He knows all about these problems and frustrations and has the plan and answers



which I need. My part is to yield to His will and timing and realize that He is in control. This is where the "Be still and know that I am God" (v. 10) comes in. But how can we let go and place these problems into His hands?

The best way for these truths to become indelibly imprinted on our minds is to spend time alone with Him on a daily basis. You see, sitting quietly before Him allows us to "listen to His still small voice" (1 Kings 19:12) and realize that He truly has everything we need to deal with what is troubling

"God is Love"

In the mid-twentieth century, Father Flanagan of Boy's Town popularized a drawing of a young child carrying a younger boy; the caption read, "He ain't heavy; he's my brother." Its history goes back to a late 19th-century book written by James Wells on the parables of Jesus [1]. In the 1970s, this idea appeared in the form of a song by the Hollies. Since then, the caption has been the title of an episode in at least three television shows. The caption sums up the idea that the presence or absence of love determines the meaning of our actions toward others. We see this idea in God's love for us as demonstrated by his grace, mercy, and forbearance.

God's love is demonstrated by grace as he pardons our sin. In love, he exercised grace and gave himself to save us (Titus 2:11, 14). Through grace, he redeems us from lawlessness and trains us to live in ways that bring him pleasure (Titus 2:11-14). Through grace, God purifies us as his people (Titus 2:14).

God's love is demonstrated by mercy as he relieves the misery of those bearing the consequences of sin. God loved and regenerated us while we despised him and could do nothing about our separation from him (Ephesians 2:1-5). God loves us even when humanity's sinful rebellion stains everything about us (Ephesians 2:5).


God's love is demonstrated by forbearance as he "bears with the sinner who does not heed the instructions and warnings of God" [2]. He withholds his wrath from those who deserve it (Romans 9:19-24). He exercises forbearance so that all who will trust him will experience his glory (Romans 9:23).

Let us rid ourselves of the notion that love is a warm, fuzzy feeling. Warm fuzzy feelings are nice, but this is not the definition of love. Love forgives when a clear wrong has been committed. Love gives kindness when punishment is deserved. Love bears with the one who is unbearable. Love sees all this not as a burden, but as an opportunity to give.

"In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:10-11, ESV).






It is very quick and easy to travel in the world today. In Bible times, it was not so easy!

#### In His Hands

John G. Paton (1824-1907) was a pioneer missionary to the South Pacific islands now known as Vanuatu. Previous evangelists to the area had been consumed by cannibals, but Paton was undeterred—even after his wife and newborn son soon died of tropical fever.

Paton clung closely to Jesus amid deprivation, animosity and many attempts on his life. "I knew not, for one brief hour when or how attack might be made," he wrote. "And yet, with my trembling hand clasped in the hand once nailed on Calvary, and now swaying the scepter of the universe, calmness and peace and resignation abode in my soul."

Today about 85 % of Vanuatu's population is Christian.
