Reflections by Pastor Rog

Dear Family,

Friendships...this thought brings joy to our hearts and yet many have asked, "If my friends really knew me, would they like me?" That's an honest question.

In my quiet time with the Lord, I read in many places of God's Word, but invariably my reading takes me back to the Psalms. One of my favorite psalms is the 139th. This is a very personal psalm in which David expresses God's full knowledge of him. (Please read Psalm 139 now.) What we understand from this psalm, as David did, is that God knows us perfectly and completely—and He loves us anyway. I wonder to myself, "How can that be?" He knows everything about me and yet He loves me! David also had a hard time understanding this. He said, "This is too glorious, too wonderful to believe" (vs. 6, TLB).

Think of it, no one knows us better than God. He knows when we go to sleep and when we wake up. He knows all of our thoughts. He sees everywhere we go and everything we do. He knows every intention of our hearts. Yes, our Heavenly knows everything about us and yet, He loves us completely.

Did you also notice that we cannot hide from Him (v. 7). There is no place where we can hide from God. One man has correctly stated, "There is nothing around the corner which is beyond God's view." Yes, He sees it all! Hebrews 4:13 reminds us that



"Nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight. Everything is uncovered and laid bare before the eyes of Him to Whom we must give account" (NIV). And yet, He still loves us. Thank you, Lord Jesus.

As we go through our daily lives, may we remember that we are never out of His sight or out of His thoughts. He is always with us and rather than being fearful of this, He desires that we take joy at always being in His presence. Everything we learn from this psalm leads us to this conclusion:

Worship Music: The Five-year Plan By Daniel Marion

If only upbeat songs about our eternally secure salvation were sung, this person might miss the reverence and awe that God is due. Or, if only songs about God's attributes were sung, this person might not understand that He is a relational God Who wants to meet us and provide for

It's not a far-fetched situation. Some nursery workers or children's volunteers end up in this position, as do some church musicians, and some parents whose children/newborns can't sit through a sermon. While these people should, of course, be studying the Word of God on their own and with fellowship groups, it is important to have a balanced music and worship time when the Church is gathered together.

us where we are.

At every service, we at TFB aim to make sure the Gospel message is laid out in song or teaching (Acts 5:42) that God's attributes are declared with thanksgiving (Psalm 100:4) and that we submit our prayers and requests with supplication through song and offering (Philippians 4:6). We don't just approach God the way WE want to because that would be self-serving. We approach Him, united as a congregation, in the balanced way that HE says we should.

"God Is in Charge (Sovereignty)"

The world seems to be out of control. Terrorism rages around the world. Protests fill the streets with pent-up pain. Politicians sling mud rather than speak wisdom. Natural disasters scar the landscape and take lives. If we try to understand the meaning of these events from a purely human perspective, we may sit down, fold our hands, and conclude there is no hope. But the meaning of reality is not determined by our human perspective. It is determined by the decree of the Sovereign Creator and Lord of all. God's decree is his "comprehensive plan for the world and its history that God sovereignly established in eternity" [1]. He guides us to live

within his decree by giving us his precepts, which are "the commands and laws that God sets for his creatures, commands which call for obedience but which are often transgressed" [2].

God is free (Psalm 135:6). By decree, he determines and accomplishes his will. To thrive, we must trust his decree and obey his precepts. But duty should not drive this trust and obedience. Praise, which flows from our love for God, drives it.

God is good (Psalm 135:13-14). His name is pleasant. We do not suffer under the harsh hand of a task master. We willingly serve God from within his loving hand. He has chosen us to be in an eternal relationship of love and trust in him. Our service to him flows from our deepest joy.

God is great (Psalm 135:5, 7-12). His decree is free. Nothing can keep him from accomplishing what he pleases. Providence, God's guiding care for his creation, and retribution, his just distribution of punishments, are under his sovereign control. And his sovereign will is not bound, for it extends through space and time and to the very foundations of reality.

As out of control as things may sometimes appear, God is always in control. He is Sovereign over all. Compassion shapes all his dealings with his servants, and he will clear away all the accusations against us. Our only sensible response is worship, echoing back upon him the blessings that he has lavished upon us (Psalm 135:1-4, 19-21).





Other News: We have purposed...to make our home a haven of hospitality, so we have been hosting as many dinners and BBQ's as we can.In this digital age it is increasingly rare and special to have people over to your house to just eat and talk. Now that school has started, we are aiming to host a Saturday dinner every weekend in addition to the Thursday night Bible study. Please keep these times in your prayers as we seek to practically share the love of Jesus through hospitality, good food and study of the Word!

Surfing: I have been able to surf a few times...and have met ex-pro snowboarder Jason Borgstede, who now owns the local snow/skate/surf shop in town. I am enjoying rekindling old relationships and building new ones as well. *Pray for more opportunities to share the Gospel with surfers, skiers and snowboarders here in Anchorage. Pray that the light of Jesus Christ in us shines brightly through us, that people can clearly see not us but the Savior we serve.*


