As we continued to travel through 2017, I want to reflect on our beginnings in the book of Acts. Have you ever noticed the incredible change that occurs in the followers of Jesus after their filling of the Holy Spirit? It is amazing!

Before they were a doubting, confused group with very little

Dear Church Family,

What a privilege it is for us to have a personal relationship with Almighty God through faith in His Son, Jesus Christ. To receive the forgiveness of sins by His grace and to be filled with His peace are beyond our comprehension, but it's true. And to be indwelt by His Spirit which gives to us His wisdom, strength, and correction is a blessing which we should rejoice in every day. But, with privilege also comes responsibility—the responsibility to live in such a way that people might see Christ in us as we move among them and interact with them. In thinking of this, my heart directed me to read Psalm 15. Would you please read it now? It's only five verses.

I'm writing this just a few days removed from our High School Winter Retreat at Lake Arrowhead.

For a few of them, it was the first time they ever had seen it snow. Even though there wasn't much snow, the 14 of us managed to get a little snow play in before it melted. The white stuff was just an added benefit to our weekend, but our primary focus was on spending time with each other, with Jesus and in God's Word.

Our theme for this retreat was "Set Free," as we studied the entire book of Galatians. We learned that Paul wrote this important letter to a group of Christians who were being enticed by some to obey the Law of Moses as a condition of being made right with God. Paul reminds the Galatians that we should not worry about what others think but instead focus on pleasing God (v. 1:10), and that we are made right, not by anything we do, but only by what Christ has done on the cross. Our response to His finished work is to trust in its sufficiency and to walk in His Spirit by faith. When we live in step with the Holy Spirit, we live in God's freedom, and His fruit is produced in our lives.

In a culture in which we are judged by what we do and how well we do it, this message of being set free from the demands of performance in order to experience God's love is truly liberating—it's Good News!

The students are excited about this Good News, and we are making plans for them to share it with their friends. Please be in prayer as we schedule some evangelistic events on Tuesday nights in the coming weeks and as they apply what they learned in the Fall about sharing Christ with others. We also begin our first High School Rooted group in February – more on that later.




February 3-5 at Thousand Pines

TFB Academy "He is Jesus, the Christ"

What are we willing to commit to out loud and in public? In the relative safety of Sunday morning worship, this is a simple question. Monday morning in the company of those who do not trust Jesus, our answer may be different. But let us go deeper: How well do we understand the one to whom we are committing ourselves?

He is Jesus (Luke 1:26-33). The angel announced to Mary, "You shall call his name Jesus" (v. 31). The name "Jesus" is the Aramaic translation of the Hebrew name "Joshua," which means "Yahweh is salvation." This one who came to earth as an infant who cried and

needed his diaper changed is the Savior for whom Israel waited. The angel declared this and more. He is great

(v. 32). He is called "Son of the Most High" (v. 32), and he will receive the "throne of his father David" (v. 32). His kingdom has no end (v. 33). He grew into a man and began his ministry. He gathered followers and selected twelve from among them whom he would teach. These twelve slowly, haltingly realized who he was.

Jesus is the Christ (Matthew 16:13-20). One day while walking from town to town, Jesus asked his disciples who the people thought he was (v. 13). The answers varied: "Some say John the Baptist, others say Elijah, and others Jeremiah or one of the prophets" (v. 14). Then Jesus asked, "But who do you say that I am?" (v. 15). Peter, prompted by God the Father, proclaimed "You are the Christ..." (v. 16). The title "Christ" is the Greek translation of the Hebrew title "Messiah," which means "Anointed One." This man Jesus is the one foretold in the Law and the Prophets. He is God in flesh, come as the Anointed One to seek and save the lost (Luke 19:9-10).

What are we willing to commit to out loud and in public? We ought to proclaim this Jesus. He fully understands what life is like here on earth. He knows temptation to its very end, for he was tempted and never gave in. He understands the depths of humility, for he is God, yet humbled himself, became human, and gave his life to save us. He created, and he rules. He is the Savior who sits on the throne of God's Eternal Kingdom. He is ever able to seek and save those who are lost. TFB Global Outreach News

Meyers' Ministry on Campus

Kraig is working on two campuses of the University of Colorado, the Denver Campus and the Boulder Campus. Tuesday evening we

have English Conversation class for international students in Boulder. Wednesday noon we have a free student lunch and Bible discussion on the Denver campus. About 15-20 students attend. Thursday evening is our home Bible study. We even have had international students come to this study. Friday evenings we have Food and Fun Night for students in Boulder. Our home church is also getting involved in the ministry in Boulder, providing dinners and making contacts with students. Kraig has been writing a small handbook for the people in our church who want to get involved with international students. If you would like to have a copy of this booklet, send me your email address, and I will send it to you.

Besides all these activities, Susan is active in teaching ESL classes at our church. About 240 students learn English each week. She has been teaching there for over eight years. Then we have our individual ministry to international students. We often go hiking or make picnics in the mountains with these students. That's one of the great benefits of living in Colorado. We are also involved in helping students get settled in the USA, transporting furniture, and taking them shopping.

Recently, we helped a ministry outreach in Washington Park in Denver for about 185 students. It was a Lamb Roast for mostly Muslim students. This was a great way to meet new students and to make friends. Kraig met a student from Saudi Arabia who was a student in Boulder He invited him to come to the Friday night dinner (which consists of abut 50-60 students) at the Horizons House. The Saudi student came and had a great time. At the end, he told Kraig, "Please, don't forget about me. I want to keep our friendship." The Saudi student seemed lonely and wanted to have an American friend.

We still have contact with some of the Iranian students from last year. In fact, we have one Iranian student living in our home with us. We were able to find homes for several other Iranians to live with Christian families.

I'm not giving you the names of all the students I've mentioned, because they don't want it known about their contact with Christians, but I do want you to pray for each one. Thank you for your faithfulness in praying for our ministry.

We also want to share with you the joy of our 50th Wedding Anniversary, which [was] celebrated at our church on October 15 [of 2016].

not believers. Worship of our Lord should be a way of life. For instance, we are called to walk in a way which is blameless. This does not mean to be perfect but upright (vs. 2). We are to show love to others through our speech and actions (vs. 3). We are to guard our relationships so that they honor God and keep our word (vs. 9). And we are to be generous in helping others, keeping in mind what the Lord has given to us (vs. 5).

As I reflect on this Psalm, the Holy Spirit is directing me to take an **inventory** of my walk with Him. In other words, is my **worship** of Him truly honoring to Him and would others with whom I meet and interact come into contact with His love and grace, or would it be "business as usual"?

Yes, it is wonderful to go to church, but more importantly, we need to BE THE CHURCH reflecting Him to others. May this be our desire today.


