### Reflections by Pastor Rog

Dear Church Family,

How thankful I am for God's word. To think that our Heavenly Father would desire to communicate with us is beyond our comprehension—but He does. One of the places I go to quite often is the Psalms. As we read through the Psalms, we sense the hurt and sorrow of life and search for answers among the numerous questions and difficulties which come our way. We see the urgent requests of those who desire to meet with God. One such psalm is Psalm 42:1-2. Here we read:

"As the deer pants for streams of water, so my soul pants for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When can I go and meet with God?"

As you reflect on this passage, you understand that the psalmist is in great need. He uses a simile from nature to express his heart. A deer pants because it has been running—and running hard—probably from danger, and now it needs to refresh itself with the cool, clear water from a spring.

We are not told exactly what the psalmist's needs were, but we believe they were <u>urgent</u>. Where could he go for spiritual refreshment? He could go to our wonderful Lord! To say it clearly, "he urgently desires the water of God"—that which will calm his life and draw him closer to the Lord; that which assures him that he is not alone.

He desires not only to be refreshed by the Lord but to be led by Him as well. This speaks to us of being alone with the Lord in prayer.

Now, I cannot speak for others, but I know that this prayer-urgency is needed in my life. Lately, the Holy Spirit has been reminding me that I need to spend more time with Him praying, not only for my own spiritual needs, but also for the spiritual needs of others—yes, interceding for them. (Perhaps He has been dealing with you in this way as well?)

God's church needs to be spiritually re-awakened, but this kind of awakening doesn't just happen. We must invite the Lord to search out our hearts and reveal to us first our own needs and then seek His wisdom on how we might intercede for others. It is so true that when we are quiet before Him, we hear His still small voice, and our lives are spiritually refreshed and changed.

I don't know what is going on in your life today, but we both know



Who desires to meet with you during your time of need. Yes, His name is Jesus. How thankful I am that He is always ready to meet with us and refresh us with His life-giving water. May we all experience His touch upon our lives as we humble ourselves before Him.



#### A Message from Ann

I'm writing this for Matt since we just recently got back from our C4 High School CLC Summer Camp, and this week Matt has been leading the opening at VBS. We have had a busy summer ever since school let out. Matt was the speaker at our Children's Lightseeker's camp, and we took five of our youth (HS and College) as Missionary Kids helping out with the overall camp program. It was really a blessing to see God use them all as they ministered to the lives of 150 children.

After the 4th of July week, we headed off to Thousand Pines for High School camp. What an amazing week! The question posed for the week in its theme was "What If..." as we studied John 8. In our group's case, it turned out to be, "What if God shows up and wrecks our misconceptions of Him." We saw that demonstrated clearly as the lives of the 21 students and leaders were forever changed by His Spirit. Two students, who had both been raised in the Church, came to know Christ personally on the last day of camp. They, along with two other C4 students, were baptized that evening.

As important as the new decisions to follow Christ were, there were also the ones who decided that they were tired of straying away from or just playing it safe with their faith. Principles to Study By

What are interpretation, exegesis, and hermeneutics, and how are they related? Sport can serve as an analogy: interpretation is the sport, exegesis is the game, and hermeneutics is the rulebook. In July, we talked about interpretation: the sport. In September, we will talk about exegesis: the game. This month is about hermeneutics: the rulebook. Bible study has rules, and we need to understand those rules or study will not be what it is supposed to be: understanding the truth the original authors intended to communicate.

Hermeneutics is the science of interpretation and produces the set of assumptions and principles we bring to interpretation. These assumptions and principles arise at the intersection of the doctrine of Scripture and the study of language and literature. Some basic principles are as follows.

- The Bible is the first and best source for interpreting itself. Read and understand the text before consulting Bible helps like introductions, commentaries, and handbooks.
- Study the specific passage and its immediate context and arrive at some initial conclusions before consulting other passages.
- The meaning of a passage is communicated through the text in context. Stick with the text itself in its grammatical, historical, and cultural context. Don't import ideas from outside.
- The grammar and structure of sentences and paragraphs matter. So, yes, it's a bit like English class.
- The meaning of each portion of Scripture always aligns with its immediate context, the book in which it is found, and the teaching of Scripture as a whole.
- Consult clear passages to help interpret difficult passages. Understand what the authors of each passage intended to communicate to the original readers, then align each interpretation with the teaching of the whole of Scripture. This will eliminate the alleged conflict.

Understanding the intended meaning of Scripture requires effort. This is not surprising, for the Bible is an ancient book written in languages that are not our own by authors from cultures unlike our own. There is a good deal of difference to traverse. But there is good news. The Bible is also authored by God, and his Spirit illuminates the text and our minds as we trust him. God wants us to understand his Word, but we must do our part. Following good hermeneutical principles is part of our responsibility. So, as we approach the study of Scripture, let us uncover and understand our assumptions, correcting them as needed. Let us approach the text as the very Word of God, which it is.






