By now most of you might be aware that our Children's Ministry Director, Levana Condon, is stepping down from her position to attend nursing school full-time. She has been a wonderful member of our staff, very successfully ministering to our children. She will be missed.

Jesus clearly placed children as a high priority when He said, "Let the children come to Me. Don't stop them, for the Kingdom of Heaven belongs to such as these" (Matthew 19:14).

This is why we here at TFB are committed to offering an active children's ministry. The Bible also teaches that parents and family life are the key piece used by God to reach and grow children. Our role as a church is to assist and support parents in that effort.

So to enhance our role in this very important area of ministry, we are changing our current Youth Pastor position to be Pastor of Family Life. This new position will oversee all our ministries to our children and their parents from nursery through Junior High.

Our current Youth Pastor, Jay Cordova, will take on this new position as our Pastor of Family Life. I also want to thank Kelli Mullin, our bookkeeper, for her seven years of faithful service and introduce our new bookkeeper Karen Davis. Along with our part -time bookkeeper position, Karen serves at the First Evangelical Lutheran Church and School in their bookkeeping department. We are happy to have her join our staff.

Reflections

Dear Church Family,

If you're like me, there are times that you take a good look at the condition of your closet and garage and realize that "clutter" has been allowed to take hold and cause problems. Spiritually speaking, this can also be true in our life of discipleship with the Lord Jesus. Negative attitudes have been allowed to take hold and hinder God's working in our lives. One of these negative attitudes is the lack of forgiveness towards fellow believers. God's Word makes it very clear that this attitude needs to be dealt with,

confessed to the Lord and forsaken. The apostle Paul reminds us of these truths in Ephesians 4:31-32:

"Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice... Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you" (NIV).

To some people what the Holy Spirit gave to Paul to share with us is radical, but **radical forgiveness** is at the heart of the Christian Gospel. It is virtually inexplicable that a holy God



would send His one-of-a-kind, sinless Son to die for the sins of the world so that we might receive forgiveness of sin and have a way to be reconciled to Him, but that's exactly what He did. Yes, the **forgiveness** that God has extended to the world is perhaps the most profound thing the human mind can ponder. It is also the <u>basis</u> for why <u>we</u>

Reporting from CPC 2014...

As many of you have already heard/read, this month I begin my new role as TFB's Pastor of Family Life. After over 20 years of serving students and their families, I'm excited about the new journey God has for me and our church.

As of this writing, I have just completed my second day at the Children's Pastors' Conference and have made some observations over the last 48 hours that I would like to share.

The first one, although not a surprise, was still mindblowing when confronted with it head on: women dominate Children's Ministries. Worshipping during our general sessions, sitting down at one of our meals, or simply walking around the



convention center, I wonder if I wandered into the wrong event. Don't get me wrong, I have been warmly welcomed by all, even with my "rookie" status. But this observation highlights for me the fact that God has blessed our Children's Ministry at TFB with a good number of men serving kids and their families—yet we would certainly welcome more men...AND women!

Another observation is that many churches, like us, want to do a better job at serving the parents of the kids that God brings to us. The fact that the exhibit hall is filled with numerous resources solely designed for parents, underscores that such a need exists. As we move forward, I certainly want us to come alongside our parents as they train and raise their kids to know God and grow in Him. In the coming months, I hope to get some of those resources into your homes.

Finally, as my head is swimming from information overload (with another day and half to go), I recognize that even after being in ministry this long, God is still wanting to teach me new things. Being a "rookie" again is not such a bad thing. I'm experiencing a mix of familiar ground and new frontiers, which is both comforting and daunting at the same time. So please join me in prayer as God leads us in the days and weeks to come.




AVERAGE WEEKLY

FOR JANUARY



"When life is drab, dark, and confusing...God"

Psalm 119:129-136 The *Pe* Strophe by Laura Springer, M.Div., Th.M

"Your testimonies are wonderful." So begins the Pe strophe of Psalm 119. The psalmist declares that God's word is wonderful (v. 129), light-giving (v. 130), and satisfying (v. 131). Life on the other hand, is not always wonderful. The psalmist knew this all too well.

"...God's people cannot,
experience God's best when
they turn their back on him
and follow their own way."

But the psalmist's life was dark and in the second section, the psalmist turns his heart to his situation and his need. He asks for God to turn toward him in kindness (v. 132), to guide him (v. 133), to rescue him (v. 134), and to bless him (v. 135). He is able to ask boldly because he knows God. He knows God treats his people with kindness. The psalmist also knows himself; he desires to follow God, not merely to be rescued by him.

As he ponders God's blessing and his own situation, his mind turns from himself to God's people.

Hope turns to sorrow as he remembers that the people of God do not follow God (v. 136). He is overwhelmed by this realization and his eyes "shed streams of tears." He knows that God's people cannot experience God's best when they turn their back on him and follow their own way.

Sometimes life is bright and all is well. Most days, we hit bumps in the road and keep going. Sometimes, the bottom drops out and life becomes drab, dark, and confusing. In each of these times, God remains good and kind. In each of these times, God longs to hear our heart--even if it is messy in there. God's heart is always for his people and his care is written across the pages of Scripture.

You will not believe this! Your prayers and investment to our last year's Pastors Conference made a significant difference to help open the iron door for the Gospel of Jesus Christ in the state of Kashmir. One man's imprisonment resulted in 9 Muslim men becoming followers and ambassadors of Christ in Kashmir.

The jailor and the officer were so astonished with the way Singh carried himself in the prison. He was joyful, singing and at peace. God gave Singh the opportunity to share the Gospel with the jailor and the officer.

No one thought he would be out of the prison, but God brought him out. Praise the Lord! Singh was sure that God took him to Kashmir but could not understand how God was going to unfold His plan of redemption in that place.

Just two days before he left Kashmir, he met a Muslim man and found out that he had become a follower of Christ but did not know how to grow in the Lord as no one discipled him. He told this new believer how he could be trained through the non-formal training program of HBI. Within a month, this man brought his cousin to HBI for one month training. As soon as they went back, one of them led 7 men to the Lord and sent them to HBI for training These 7 men came and were discipled. Amazingly one of these men landed at HBI last month with another two young men whom he led to Christ.

The ripple that was started by one man's imprisonment, keeps going on...reaching men and women for Christ Jesus! This could be possible only because Brother Singh could attend the Pastor's Conference....

...Friends, your involvement through prayers and supporting these simple village church planters is truly resulting in plenteous harvest and raising up harvesters...

forgive other people. You see, we are to forgive others as God, in Christ, has forgiven us.

What Paul writes in Ephesians is not new. It is clearly an amplification of how our Lord taught His disciples to pray. In Matthew 6:12, He said this:

"Forgive our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors" (NIV).

It is clear to us, then, that our Lord teaches us to pray in such a way that as we ask our Heavenly Father to forgive us, we ask Him to forgive us *in the same way we forgive others*. We then are presented with a choice — to forgive or NOT to forgive.

Let's face it, forgiving others can be difficult, but it is important that we do it. This kind of radical forgiveness magnifies Christ. It teaches us that this kind of forgiveness is to be an ongoing posture of our hearts. And finally, it keeps us from locking ourselves into a self-built jail where bitterness, rage, anger, slander, and malice are our cell mates.

Tell me, is there someone you/I need to forgive? If so, may we forgive them as the Lord Jesus has freely forgiven us.
