


Mariner's Church October 16 Night Out! 5:00~10:30 p.m.




Gift Suggestions for Samaritan's Purse Shoeboxes Due between October 4 and November 1



Toys: Include items that children will immediately embrace such as dolls, toy cars, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, flashlights & toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), etc.

School Supplies: pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

- Non-Liquid Hygiene Items: toothpaste, toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.
- Accessories: t-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, lip gloss, etc.
- A Personal Note: You may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. If you include your name and address, the child may be able to write back.
- Do Not Include: Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

TFB Academy "Unity: We Are One"

In Torrance alone, the variety of Christian expression boggles the mind. At TFB, more than 400 persons gather for worship, ministry, study, and fellowship throughout each week, and each person expresses faith just a bit differently. In Torrance, there are at least eleven Christian traditions represented by churches, and each congregation expresses their

"Unity begins with our connection to Christ and through him to one another." very different tradition in a unique, local way. The worldwide variety is beyond comprehension. This staggering diversity exists alongside unity. The Christians from many cultures, languages, traditions, and personalities form the one Church. I don't know about you, but I need to sit back and let that sink in.

Too often, I think of unity as some form of uniformity. Maybe it's the same for you. But the biblical idea of unity is not about our similarities at all. Unity

begins with our connection to Christ and through him to one another. In Christ, unity is essential to our identity (Ephesians 2:19). It is not simply a nice idea to emphasize or a goal to achieve. It is part of who we are as Church. But we still have work to do, for God calls us to be eager to maintain the unity given by the Spirit (Ephesians 4:3-4). We maintain our unity by sharing responsibility as fellow citizens of God's people and fellow members of God's household (Ephesians 2:19).

Unity is essential to the very good end that God has for us in Christ (Ephesians 2:21-22). Jesus desires us to be one just as he and the Father are one (John 17:22). What a high calling for our unity! Our sure relationship with God and with one another secures this very good end. In Christ, we are becoming God's holy temple. In him, we are being built together into a dwelling place for God.

Here on earth the Church appears to be divided into many traditions and congregations, but the heavenly reality is quite different. In the context of eternity, the Church is one People, one New Humanity, one Fellowship, one Body. In eternity, divisions will be healed and diversity will flourish alongside unity.

- There is never a moment in which you face life without God. God is near.



From Stephen and Cindi Barrett, working with Athletes in Action

Dear Friends,

After completing our Mongolia project in June, I headed for Moldova to meet a team led by John Peterson. He and his son Justin brought 6 tough Christian college wrestlers. Our goal was to help Valera Kuznetsov who is an AIA volunteer in Moldova. He is a teacher/wrestling coach who has worked for many years in the poorest region of Moldova, and Moldova is considered the poorest country in Europe.

We arrived in Moldova and spent a couple of days training with members of the junior national wrestling team in the capital of Chisinau. During our time with the team, we made friends with the Moldovan wrestlers and shared the Gospel with all of them. Next we headed for the town of Kamrat. On the way, we stopped at a local prison for an outreach and soccer game with the prisoners. They soundly beat us because we are, after all, wrestlers! In Kamrat, we held a tournament and 7-day wrestling camp for 145 coaches and wrestlers from Ukraine, Turkey, Moldova, Bulgaria and the U.S. We had tough competition, great evening programs and a lot of fun! Thanks to your partnership, many campers have now heard the Gospel.

We never know what will happen when a team of Americans mixes with local athletes in a foreign country but friendships often develop. A wrestler from the June tour to Mongolia will be hosting Idri, a Christian wrestling coach and three wrestlers in North Carolina. Other Christian families are also considering hosting them for a week or two. I met Idri 7 years ago when I took a group to Mongolia. After we visited Idri's wrestling club, he destroyed the idols he formerly worshipped and put his faith in Jesus. He is looking forward to meeting American coaches, and his wrestlers will be encouraged by the training and friends they meet in America.

Soon after I return to the U.S. in late August, I plan to meet the national Mongolian men's freestyle wrestling team and take them to California for a training camp prior to the World Championships of wrestling September 5-10. Good friends in Bakersfield and Riverside will host the team. Many details still need to be worked out before they arrive in the U.S.! *[Ed. Note: obviously this has already happened.]*

Ministry has kept us busier than ever since returning to Missouri. Doors keep opening as we walk through them, and we want to thank each of you for partnering with us. I recently told Cindi that I have a dream to take a wrestling team to Central Asia next summer as well as the other teams and camps we normally host. There just doesn't seem to be enough time for everything. Only the Lord can make this happen.

Thank you for faithfully praying and sponsoring us in the work the Lord is giving us to do.
